

# EBU Contacts your players after your events

If you are an affiliated club, and you recently submitted a result to the EBU, you may have been surprised to find that the players received an email from the EBU as a consequence.

Here's an example:



# Your results from Kenilworth Bridge Club on Wednesday 7th August

Dear Nicky,

Congratulations for having played in this session, your 10<sup>th</sup> session at Kenilworth Bridge Club this year and your 91<sup>st</sup> session played anywhere this year.

You scored 63.36% and came 2<sup>nd</sup> N/S out of a field of 9 N/S pairs; there were 18 pairs overall. The strength of opposition was 47.13% according to the EBU's National Grading Scheme (NGS) and your score translates to 7.69% higher than NGS predicted - well done! Your new NGS grade is 51.94%. You have earned 20 local master points.

This was your 10<sup>th</sup> best performance this year out of 90 sessions according to the NGS system.

Overall, you have played in 2235 sessions since the current system of submitting results started in 2010

- 193 at Kenilworth Bridge Club since the system started
- · 1134 with Jim Bainbridge since the system started

You have received this email as the English Bridge Union (EBU) has started sending out session results emails when you play in a session at an affiliated club. I know this came as a surprise to many. Although there were a few references to this new "service" in some EBU documents, it was not formally announced until 7th August, and it began immediately. I got my first EBU communication when I played in another club on 9th August.

I enquired of the EBU what problem this "service" was intended to address. I got no answer.

My club always sends an email to each of the players in our events with a link to the BridgeWebs record of the event. A second email could only be confusing.

I turned this facility off before it was implemented. You can do this in your club's information form, available in your clubs

MyEBU. Players can turn this off for themselves.

# Consultation/Communication

This is a great example of something that could have been communicated in "Updates from Aylesbury". An announcement at

least a couple of weeks would have been good. This is communication. An early announcement that it was under consideration would have been even nicer. That would be consultation.

I have some issues with this. (Yes, I am being a little cynical.)

- 1 This is not the best use of development resources at the EBU, there are far more valuable things they could have done. (For example promote and expand the EBU Teacher Directory, still not growing or changing despite promises)
  - 2 It is not clear where the idea came from, or what problem it solves, or whether any effective consultation took place.
- 3 The EBU says it is to promote the Master Points and National Grade systems to players, thereby hoping to tie the club into affiliation and its costs? We need to promote bridge to non bridge players.
- 4 Finally will the EBU to stick to this particular content? How long before they start promoting their events in these emails?

For many years some clubs have expressed unhappiness with the EBU marketing EBU events, of all kinds, to players. When you are still trying to build numbers after Covid, it can feel that the EBU is competing with clubs for a limited player/session market.

It is quite an effort to recruit new bridge players to a club/classes. There will be quite some time before they will be interested in Master Points or National Grade. While they are learning I prefer to keep them focused on the bridge activities I provide or recommend (e.g. No Fear Bridge).

I don't provide any contact details for new players to the EBU when I

set up their membership. In the past I probably wouldn't have set them up at all until they had completed a beginners course, but now I use the BridgeWebs member account function, and that is driven by EBU number, so I get EBU numbers for players early. I provide no details beyond a name.

Each time I do this, I get an email from a diligent member of the EBU staff asking me for contact details.

There is still an "anonymous" tick box in the membership set up form, presumably I should check this.

Not ticking the "Receive EBU emails" and "Receive EBED emails" does not prevent EBU contact. Aylesbury considers there are "essential" emails that they still send, including asking for a postal address.

The Club Terms of Affiliation were updated n February. There is no reference to providing member data to the EBU. It also includes requirement to conform to the EBU bylaws. They are not well written, but there is no reference to providing member data. I cannot see that affiliated clubs are obliged to do so.

By the way, the Bye Laws and Articles are being reviewed. There is no communication on why, what the goals are, or what the timetable is. Perhaps there could be communication/consultation?

# **Player Numbers**

The number of club sessions analysed in detail has reached 1605 from 641 clubs, but 561 posted table numbers on their web site.

This has now reached the level where it seems reasonable to estimate the number of player sessions, playing duplicate, in all clubs in the database.

# Five goals for the EBU in 2024 AUGUST Update

**1 EBU Member Numbers** 

Let's see this deficit get smaller in 2024

It is now **NINE** months since it emerged, that in the year to Nov 2023 there was a 3.000 net loss in membership. That's a half of a year. The EBU will have access to the latest position and so will know whether there is any sign of improvement.

Overall player membership of the EBU is down from 55,000 to 50,000 in four years.

However, fewer players are playing more often, This means UM income to the EBU has stablised, possibly leading to less focus on player numbers within the EBU organisation.

**BUT** 

The average age player members is estimated at 74, If they have an average of ten years playing life left, and they are not replaced there will be none in ten years. No UMS. No EBU.

#### 2 The Annual General Meeting

Let's have a more practical, more open, more democratic format in 2024.

The AGM reverted to Face to face in a London hotel. Representatives from counties some distance from London faced more expense and travelling time. Many resorted to proxies. The meeting was only open to shareholders and their proxies, no public, no press, no playing members, no representatives of clubs, teachers or other bridge organisers. It was not recorded, so the record of the proceedings is limited to formal minutes and informal notes and discussions.

The chair undertook to look at a hybrid online and face to face form with electronic real time voting. This would allow a far greater audience, more participation, and a recording easily made widely

#### available.

A London hotel has been booked for the 2024 AGM. It is has been noted that there is no need for a Hybrid online/F2F meeting. No change to the "rule" that only shareholders or their proxies may attend.

# NO PROGRESS In fact documented decision not to change.

#### In the meantime.....



The WBU AGM will be held online on Zoom on Sunday 2nd June 11am.

The long awaited AGM, which was delayed by the Covid-19 situation, will be held on Zoom on Sunday October 11th at 11.45am for a midday start. To register for the AGM, please click on this link: or send your name and WBU number to ceri@wbu.org . You will then be emailed a link to join the meeting.

#### "WBU FOCUS GROUPS

You are ALL invited to come along to the first focus groups of the WBU, which will be held on Zoom. This is an opportunity to air your views and share your ideas on how the WBU can change and improve. It is also a chance for you to volunteer your time / skills to help us achieve that improvement. We welcome ex-members as well as current members – we want to hear from you all."

### **3 Updates from Aylesbury**

Any member able to request this newsletter by opting for it in their member account.

That way more people can be informed about bridge organisation.

The monthly update from Aylesbury is largely used as a vehicle for marketing EBU run events. However, it can contain information important to club and county organisers, and of interest to teachers and players.

At present, the EBU sends to its own distribution list of club and county officials. It is difficult to keep this list up to date.

It would be so good if the EBU could adopt a policy of actively informing and educating about bridge, especially organising bridge. You have to persist in searching the web site for so many things, or directly request access from individuals. It would be so much more powerful if any member can subscribe or unsubscribe from a complete and dynamic list of interests e.g. events, teaching, directing etc.

There's no progress here. This would be an issue that I would want to tackle urgently. I know from years of running this newsletter just how poorly members, players, club organisers etc are informed. I am sure this constricts the flow of volunteers to help.

July - We are going to have to do this ourselves. See above.

#### **4 EBU Teachers Directory**

There were about 200 entries in February. With wide publicity, let's double this number in 2024.

This directory is used by the EBU to pass on enquiries for lessons. Any

teacher can be on the directory. It's not limited to EBEDTA members, or to those who use particular materials, systems or methods. It has real potential to boost numbers learning the game. Teachers put themselves into the directory.

Regrettably the count on 2<sup>nd</sup> March is still 200 entries. This is an area the EBU should be using all channels to promote. This directory has the potential to be the "landing page" for all people looking to learn bridge. This is key to recruiting new bridge players.

The EBU could promote it in:
All EBU members email
All Club/County organisers email (Updates from Aylesbury)
By agreement with EBED to EBTA members

None of the above has happened. However there are an additional six entries in the directory as of 10th May. At that rate it will be doubled in a mere 8 years. This is important because teachers recruit new players. Connecting potential learners to existing teachers helps this happen. The independence of this directory from EBED is crucial to its success. Please can the board understand this. Don't use the irrelevant upsets to delay this real progress.

JULY UPDATE We are told this directory is going to be merged with EBEDTA. Hopefully no restrictions on who can be listed will be introduced. More hopefully some effort will be made to further grow the number of entries. THEN some effort at national PR to attract potential learners to it would be lovely.

AUGUST UPDATE No visible progress here despite the closeness of the September/October course starts. Any chance of a plan for January?

#### **5 Freeze UM**

Freeze UM in 2025/26 to reduce financial pressure on clubs.

UM is a cost of doing business for affiliated clubs. The level of EBU plus County UM has reached about 50p per player per qualifying session.

Table money is generally £2, £2.50 or £3. The median is £2.50. That means the EBU UM is 20%. Clubs have venues, and various other expenses to meet.

There is no official response to this idea. Informally, the comment is that the EBU don't see how they can afford it.

During enquiries we made before the 2023 AGM, it emerged that the Aylesbury building has been valued at £1.1M. There is over a million pounds of shareholders money invested in a building that is clearly too big.

The EBU Board lost it's treasurer and has supported a director with no financial experience to stand in until November. (The board has appointed another of its directors with no financial experience as EBED treasurer). There is no sign of active management of the finances to make possible a UMS freeze.

JULY UPDATE Hopefully the EBU is intending to reduce the financial burden on clubs by freezing rather than the usual rather automatic increase.


#### **AUGUST Update**



Here's how face to face and online sessions are distributed across the week.





The thin blue band at the bottom represents clubs that offer both face to face and online and combine at least one session into a hybrid result.

Above it, the orange section represents clubs that offer both face to face and online sessions.

Of over 700 (roughly half EBU Affiliated) active clubs the majority are offering only face to face. That's the steadily growing red section.

The green belt above that shows clubs that are only offering online sessions. Most of these are quite small and are unable to persuade their members back into the bridge room.
