# Secretary/Acting Chairman's Report for the Cardiff Bridge Club 50<sup>th</sup> AGM Tuesday 21<sup>st</sup> January 2025

Welcome to you all and thank you for attending this years' AGM.

The year of our 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary was sadly affected by the tragic and untimely death of our Chairman, Glyn Meredith, on the 2<sup>nd</sup> July. He was growing into the job and had been bringing fresh ideas to the table. In his honour we held our Chairman's Charity in his name. As a result of this and donations raised by his children, we were able to send £2005 to Velindre Cancer Centre.

As a contrast one of our Members, Edith Wade, has just celebrated her 100<sup>th</sup> birthday. Congratulations from us all.

2024 started with the Xmas Party and Individual Event and was quickly followed by the second Hirst Kurbalija Swiss Teams, which was again both enjoyable and successful. Thereafter, we were able to hold all our Annual Special Events. You will see details of the winners later.

These included the Chairman's Charity, our 50th Anniversary celebrations and the Geoff Evans Quiz. They worked tirelessly to help make sure they were all successful. I am extremely grateful to them and also to David Buttrick and Simon Lee for their help too. If any of you are prepared to become part of your Social Committee to help share the workload that would be much appreciated. The Quiz was enjoyable and successful once again with the Hall full to capacity. I am pleased to say that Anna and Kevin have agreed to run it again this year on the 5<sup>th</sup> December 2025. Thank you both and your helpers very much indeed.

Thanks, are also due to the many of you have been called upon to provide food and raffle prizes for various events. You have not let us down.

A major situation occurred earlier in the year when due to proposed Legislation Spade Tickets had to close down. This caused a lot of extra work not least for several people, including our Bookkeeper, Carole Hibbs. Simon Gottschalk has come to our rescue and over a period of time has developed Club Tickets, which is now fully operational and which I would entreat you all to use. You can view your Masterpoints and Handicaps amongst many other things. Simon is still looking at ways to expand it. I cannot imagine how many hours, days and weeks he has spent on this. We are in his debt. I must also take this opportunity of thanking Brian Quinlan for the considerable amount of work he did in developing Spade Tickets and in maintaining it over several years. He has also helped considerably with the handover, so as to speak.

This leaves my final thanks, which goes go to the remaining Committee members. They meet monthly and as necessary and take on other tasks. The care they have for the Club is demonstrated by the fact that they have all agreed to stand again this year.
