Mixed and Seniors Teams on Road to Marrakesh

After the thrilling climax to the All Africa Pairs the teams competitions saw the Mixed and the Seniors Teams Championships get under way. The Seniors will play six complete Round Robins and the Mixed will undertake three over the coming days before deciding the Champions of Africa.

Before the start of play the president **Mr Bernard Pascal** emerged onto the Realbridge screens to welcome and encourage all the teams and he did this in three languages: Arabic, English and French.

It is still very early days and postions after one day may not be reflected after four more days of toil.

In the Mixed **South Africa** lead **Kenya** with **Egypt** lying third. In the Seniors **Egypt** head **South Africa** and **Reunion**.

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


All Africa Pairs - The Last Two Rounds

The end of the third round of the All Africa Pairs saw an immense tussle at the top of the leader-board. Bernard Pascal & Hany Dagher had moved up from tenth position to be less than one match-point behind Mahmoud Zaintoun & Karim Amry. Lurking in third spot was Rob Stephens & Nicola Bateman. Neville Eber & Hennie Fick were some 15 matchpoints adrift in fourth position.

So we will look at the last six boards and see how the results panned out.




The barrage had the effect of propelling the opposition into a risky slam. Mahmoud and Karim had some fortune her when North nor unsurprisingly lead the ace of clubs – the only card to give the contract and 19 valuable MPs, Bernard & Hany were playing Neville & Hennie and they shared the points 10-10. Zaitoun & Karim now had a ten point buffer.

Zaitoun & Karim defended against North's opening bid of 1NT. They defended excellently- taking the spade lead and then switching to hearts and after taking two tricks reverting to spades so they had three spades, two hearts and a club to hold declarer to her contract. That was 17 more MPs to the leaders Neville & Hennie got slightly the better of Bernard & Hany 13-7. The leaders were now a top ahead with four boards to play


After Mahmoud made a pre-emptive raise to the three-level of his partner's opening bid of One Spade and bought the contract but finished two light for 8 MPs. Fick finished in 3NT as East and also failed by two tricks so on this board they returned the favour to Bernard & Hany13-7.

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


Board 19. Dealer South. E/W Vul.



The whole room played in Two Hearts by North. All our contenders played to par of 2♥+1 but as on four tables the defence went awry it meant achieving par as declarer was only worth 6 MPs, so Bernard & Hany gained 14 MPs whilst the other two scored 6 MPs.


After Bernard decided to open with One Diamond it gave North the chance to make a light protective bid at the one-level. South was perhaps over eager with her raise to game and West punished this with a red card. Declarer could not escape for less than two off and so Bernard scored a near top of 19 MPs.

Neville & Hennie scooped the pot when East/ West finished in Three Spades after opening One Diamond. Their defence was excellent and declarer assisted them slightly and finished down two and this gave them all of the MPs.

When Mahmoud sitting North could not find a protective bid over East's third-in-hand opening

bid of One Spade that became the final contract. The defence was not electrifying and allowed declarer two overtricks. Only 4 MPs.And now for the first time 'new leader!' by 8 MPs.

After the multi opening East/West only managed to reach game in the minor. It must have seemed a good result for Mahmoud & Karim as slam is cold in both diamonds and hearts, so they would have beaten anyone who bid slam or played in hearts but no one reached the laydown slam and only two pairs played in hearts. The upshot was that significantly beating par was worth only 8 MPs.

This was the only table where North could not find a weak opening bid. It allowed the opposition more space and whilst they did not investigate the possibility of slam they played in the higher scoring strain. So Bernard & Hany consolidated their lead to win the championship by nearly half a top.

Have a moment's pity for Rob Stephens & Nicola Bateman who were lying in a good third position but they had a miserable final round scoring just 11MPs over the three boards to see them pipped into fourth place by 2MPs.

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




Seniors Round1 Egypt vs. South Africa


South's pragmatic bid closed the auction and saw West lead the jack of hearts. South won and played ace and another club. When the diamond finesse succeeded there were ten tricks.

West chose a good time to open a slightly off-centre 1NT as it prevented the opposition getting into the auction. The defence was not dynamic and the contract only failed by one trick but that was 11 IMPs to South Africa

The East hand does not lend itself to scientific treatment though perhaps opening with a game-forcing bid might give you more of a chance. Six Hearts is just a punt. In fact Six Hearts has a chance – about 18% according to my calculations. Declarer lost the obvious two hearts and a club for two off.

Here you seem to be giving up on the chances of a slam far too easily – give partner jack to three hearts and the queen of clubs and you can more or less throw Six Hearts against the wall. On this occasion prudence prevailed and netted 13 IMPs for South Africa.

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


North had a shrewd idea that trumps were not breaking kindly for declarer and so produced his red card. Unsurprisingly declarer lost control and only managed five tricks, that was five down and 1100 in the out column. As an interesting aside no trick started with lead of a diamond.

North is probably still explaining to South that following a Pass a red card would have hit the table and that might have been a better result. West led the king of spades and continued when it was ducked. For reasons unexplained South spurned the easy crossruff to ten tricks and tacked trumps and so now was three light. The good news is that going down two more than necessary only cost 2 IMPs but the loss on the board was 17 IMPs.

Although not alerted the 1NT response had all the hallmarks of forcing for one round. The rebid of 2NT showed eleven points and North with a bare thirteen elected to pass. After the lead of a diamond to the ◆8 and ◆10 the clubs were established and West continued the diamond attack. East took the ace but could not lead another and so switched to a spade which declarer allowed West to win but now he ten tricks.

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




A Roundup of Some Deals from Round Robin 2



South led the ♥4 taken by the ace. Dummy was entered with the ♣K to ruff a heart. Dummy was the reentered with a top diamond and another heart ruffed. A trump to the queen saw North take the ace and played another heart again ruffed in hand. Declarer had no option but to cross to dummy with a diamond and cash the top spade and hope the jack fell. It was her birthday and now declarer had twelve tricks. At trick seven had North returned the ♠J to deny the chance of ruffing the last heart declarer should still have got home as when she cashes dummy's last trump North is squeezed in the minors.

Tim and Janne were obviously on a roll as we now come to Board 5

Janne won the spade lead, took three rounds of trumps in dummy, came to hand with a diamond and drew the outstanding trump. A heart towards dummy's king saw South rise with the ace and when the diamonds proved to be 3-3 declarer was home in a delicate slam.

This time it was the South African Seniors of James Grant & Larry Chemaly sitting East/West

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

Larry received the lead of the jack of hearts which he won in hand and played ace and another diamond to the queen and North's king. The heart return was won in hand and now declarer had to embark on a series of hair-raising finesses, if either of the black suit finesses failed then the contract failed but today the bridge gods were smiling. If you had been foolhardy enough to bid the grand slam then you could have made it with the help of four finesses (you need the double finesse in clubs) but also might have avoided catching the eye of the opposition.

Local Time

All times quoted within the Bulletins are GMT:

Morocco and Tunisia are one hour ahead.

South Africa is two hours ahead.

Egypt and Kenya are three hours ahead and

Reunion is four hours ahead.

So at 2.00 p.m. it is 3.00 p.m. in Morocco and Tunisia, 4.00 p.m. in South Africa and Egypt, 5.00 p.m. in Kenya and 6.00 p.m. in Reunion.

Play Links

Each category will have its own playing link (Open teams link—Women teams link .. etc. Play links will be posted to the captains' WhatsApp group and will be also posted to the ABF website at the following link

Click the Match number, official start time or Session open time of your category to join the game. The game will be open to players 30 min before the official start time.

1. Open, Women & Mixed Categories.

For the Semi-final, Final and play-off sessions, It has been decided that:

- The team ranked higher after the RR stage will be the Home team in sessions 2 and 4 in the Semi-final match.
- The team ranked lower after the RR stage will be the Home team in sessions 1 and 3 in the Semi-Final match.
- The team ranked higher after the RR stage will be the Home team in session 2 in the Final or Play-off match.
- If Morocco team qualify to the final match in any category, there will be a 4 Segments play-off match between the semi-final losers to determine the team to qualify to Marrakesh.

2. All Africa Pairs tie-break procedure

If two pairs or more have the same cumulative score after the end of the 2nd session or 4th Session, the tie shall be broken as follows:

- A. The pair with the higher score in the 2nd / 4th session shall determine the final ranking.
- B. Mutual boards between the tied pairs if applicable -

3. Teams Events ... Last RR

The last Round Robin for all categories shall be done according to the final ranking of the teams in the previous played rounds.

8. Time delay and hesitation

- It is very important to know that the TDs have the tools to produce a board report which includes the time for each bid / play by each player, so please be bare that in mind when calling the TD for a possible hesitation or before denying it.
- It is also very important to know that the TDs also have the tools to produce a session time report which includes the exact time taken by each player in a session, in case of time delay, the penalty will be given according to this report.

9. Home & Visiting teams

- When you log in to the RealBridge game (using the game link), you will find your team name written on one of the Tables.
- All team members are required to sit at their table (all together) in Pairs NS and EW, later on, when we start the session, the software will automatically move the EW pairs between the tables according to the schedule of play.
- In the schedule of play you will find Home team (the team mentioned first) and Visiting team (the team mentioned second)
- NO LINE-UP will be needed from the teams, the visiting team has to sit first at their table (in Pairs NS and EW), minimum 10 min before the official start time, and the Home team has the right to have a look at the visiting team and sit its pairs accordingly.

10. Headphones / Earphones

In order to minimize the noise in the venue as much as possible...

- It is mandatory for each player to have his own headphone / earphone which is connected to his device during play
- Use the table chat / private chat as much as possible and don't use vocal chat.
- Any vocal explanation will not be taken into the TD consideration in any case.
- You need to be very careful when using the table chat as you might give an unauthorized information to your partner which could results in adjusted score by the TD.

11. Kibitzers

- Kibitzers are not allowed by any means at 1) the playing venue, 2) RealBridge online playing room.
- All players are required to immediately leave the playing area when they finish their session, players are also kindly asked to keep their seats and not roam around the playing area.

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- At the RealBridge kibitzer website, you can find the live broadcasted matches and also all the other matches scheduled for broadcast.
- For security reasons, all broadcasted matches will be delayed by 30-45 min.

12. Smoking, Eating and Alcohol, Mobile and electronic devices

We must act as if we were playing these championships "live", therefore, the following is strictly forbidden during play:

- Mobile phones and any other electronic devices, Mobile phones will be collected and there will be a regular check each session by the monitor.
- Eating (even if only biscuits)
- Drinking Alcohol
- Smoking
- Going to the WC without permission
- Talking loudly during or at the end of any board if the player is unhappy about his/her partner's bid, hand play or defense.



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

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

Second: Bidding, Play, Alert and System

13. At the start of any session, All the team members are required to be seated at the same table (Table with the <u>team name label</u>), the system will automatically move the EW pairs to the opponents table when we start the session and will send them back to their home table when both tables finish playing the boards.

- It is strongly recommended to use the chat rather than the vocal chat; the TDs will not take into consideration any vocal explanation if you have any case.

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

- 3. Make bid



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









If you make a **mistake** or need to **explain your bid further** after you have bid, you can click on the bid and add more text.
