The Open And The Women Championships Commence

President Bernard Pascal welcomed all the players to the Open and Women Championships. He was eloquent in three languagea: Arabic, English and French; and wished all the players the best of luck.

In the Open Championship both Egypt and South Africa won all three of their matches on day one so the standings are Egypt five points ahead of South Africa with Tunisia nine points adrift in third position.

In the Women Championship not much can be read into the first day's results as bye features and until at least one Round Robin has been completed it can give a bias to the results, but currently Egypt lead South Africa by four points who in turn are three points ahead of Morocco.

Both events have four more days to complete three complete Roun Robins before playing semi-finals and finals. This is not a sprint, more like a half marathon.

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
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Open Championship Day 1 Session 1 South Africa v Reunion

The very first session of the Open Championships tarted with South Africa facing off against Reunion.





The lead was a trump and declarer took two rounds ending in hand and played a small heart towards the ♥10 which lost to the ♥Q. Having misguessed the hearts declarer could not avoid the loss od two diamonds and a club and so his contract failed. When the 4-1 break in the trump suit came to light the theory of vacant spaces says that the queen of hearts will be in the West hand 12 times out of 21 or 58%.

Again the lead was a trump and a second round was cashed, this time ending in dummy and the heart suit was then tackled by finessing against West and when the ▲10 was not covered declarer had an easy four heart tricks and so his contract and 12 IMPs to Reunioin

When West elected to open an off-shape 1NT it meant that he became the declarer in the heart slam. North led a spade won in hand and declarer played a small heat to the ♠9 which lost to the singleton king. A price well worth paying as had declarer risen with the ace and South held all three hearts he would have gone down in a solid contract.

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

With East declaring the contract the lead was the singleton \clubsuit 6, covered by the \clubsuit 10, queen and king. Now when declarer led a trump he had a dilemma, should he play the ace and ensure that there could be no club ruff or should he take the safety play in the trump suit. A priori, North holding five clubs is about 7.5% and South holding all three hearts 11% and in fact if North has five clubs the chances of South having the three hearts goes up to 19%. There is also the case when South does have a singleton club he also has only one trump. So based on the a priori odds one should take the trump safety play, the question is how do you read the opening lead. I saw declarer think at length about the problem before taking the trump safety play. This only fails if South has a singleton club and a doubleton heart which a priori is about 4.5%. Declarer undoubtedly was unlucky.





When North decided not to bid the full value at the first available opportunity it gave the opposition the chance to discover their spade fit and the chance for a very good save. The defence cashed their heart trick and exited in trumps. Declarer drew another round and exited with a diamond. Two diamonds could be cashed but once they opened up the club suit they could only take one trick in the suit and so declarer only failed by one trick and gained 11 IMPs for South Africa.



Declarer won the opening lead of the king of clubs with his ace and promptly led the queen of hearts which lost to the king. South got off lead with his singleton queen of diamonds. Declarer winning and playing a ttrump to the king and ace. This time South exited with a club, ruffed in dummy. Declarer attempted to cash the two top hearts but North ruffed and cashed the king of diamonds and gave his partner a ruff to beat the contract by two tricks.

The king of clubs was lead, taken by the ace and a trump to the king which South won with his ace. He returned his queen of diamonds to declarer's ace and a losing heart finesse saw South exit with his smallest club which forced North's queen, ruffed in dummy. Now with the ♣J established declarer only need to lead towards the ◆J to establish the tenth trick. And gain 11 IMPs for South Africa.

At then of the match both teams were probably feeling lucky that on Board 10 the opposition also failed to reach the laydown grand slam. It was a small win for South Africa 11.76-8.24VPs.

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

The very first session of the Women Championships saw Tunisian Ladies take on those from Morocco.







South won North's opening lead of a trump and returned her singleton queen of diamonds taken in hand. Declarer took two more rounds of trumps ending in hand. A losing finesse of the queen of hearts saw South returning a club which declarer won in hand with the ace. Two top hearts were cashed and another ruffed to establish the thirteenth and now a diamond towards the jack created the tenth trick. 11 IMPs to Morocco. At the end of the match Tunisia had lost 5.61-14.39 VPs to Morocco.

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





Playing a non-forcing Stayman South was able to find their 4-4 major fit. The trump lead went to the queen and ace. Another trump was played and that ran to East's jack. The ♥9 was next and declarer played the queen and West ducked or misclicked. Now declarer was home because he could play for the ♣J to be onside or the hearts 3-3. Both worked so declarer had ten tricks.

Like many with a 4333 hand North did not bother to try for a major fit. The ◆3 went to partner's jack and declarer's king. A small club towards dummy's queen held the trick and a small spade from dummy whereupon East failed to split his honours and so declarer won with the ♠8. A spade to the king to lead a club from dummy to the ♠9 and jack. West now established his diamonds. North now tried a failing heart finesse and West cashed out for two down. 13 IMPs to Kenya

By the end of the match Tunisia had a comfortable win 18.44-1.56 IMPs.

Play Links

Each category will have its own playing link (Open teams link-Women teams link .. etc.

Play links will be posted to the captains' WhatsApp group and will be also posted to the ABF website at the following link

Click the Match number, official start time or Session open time of your category to join the game. The game will be open to players 30 min before the official start time.

1. Open, Women & Mixed Categories.

For the Semi-final, Final and play-off sessions, It has been decided that:

- The team ranked higher after the RR stage will be the Home team in sessions 2 and 4 in the Semi-final match.

- The team ranked lower after the RR stage will be the Home team in sessions 1 and 3 in the Semi-Final match.

- The team ranked higher after the RR stage will be the Home team in session 2 in the Final or Play-off match.

- If Morocco team qualify to the final match in any category, there will be a 4 Segments play-off match between the semi-final losers to determine the team to qualify to Marrakesh.

2. All Africa Pairs tie-break procedure

If two pairs or more have the same cumulative score after the end of the 2nd session or 4th Session, the tie shall be broken as follows:

A. The pair with the higher score in the 2nd / 4th session shall determine the final ranking.

B. Mutual boards between the tied pairs - if applicable -

3. Teams Events ... Last RR

The last Round Robin for all categories shall be done according to the final ranking of the teams in the previous played rounds.

8. Time delay and hesitation

- It is very important to know that the TDs have the tools to produce a board report which includes the time for each bid / play by each player, so please be bare that in mind when calling the TD for a possible hesitation or before denying it.

- It is also very important to know that the TDs also have the tools to produce a session time report which includes the exact time taken by each player in a session, in case of time delay, the penalty will be given according to this report.

9. Home & Visiting teams

- When you log in to the RealBridge game (using the game link), you will find your team name written on one of the Tables.
- All team members are required to sit at their table (all together) in Pairs NS and EW, later on, when we start the session, the software will automatically move the EW pairs between the tables according to the schedule of play.
- In the schedule of play you will find Home team (the team mentioned first) and Visiting team (the team mentioned second)
- NO LINE-UP will be needed from the teams, the visiting team has to sit first at their table (in Pairs NS and EW), minimum 10 min before the official start time, and the Home team has the right to have a look at the visiting team and sit its pairs accordingly.

10. Headphones / Earphones

In order to minimize the noise in the venue as much as possible...

- It is mandatory for each player to have his own headphone / earphone which is connected to his device during play
- Use the table chat / private chat as much as possible and don't use vocal chat.
- Any vocal explanation will not be taken into the TD consideration in any case.
- You need to be very careful when using the table chat as you might give an unauthorized information to your partner which could results in adjusted score by the TD.

11. Kibitzers

- Kibitzers are not allowed by any means at 1) the playing venue, 2) RealBridge online playing room.
- All players are required to immediately leave the playing area when they finish their session, players are also kindly asked to keep their seats and not roam around the playing area.

12. Smoking, Eating and Alcohol, Mobile and electronic devices

We must act as if we were playing these championships "live", therefore, the following is strictly forbidden during play:

- Mobile phones and any other electronic devices, Mobile phones will be collected and there will be a regular check each session by the monitor.
- Eating (even if only biscuits)
- Drinking Alcohol
- Smoking
- Going to the WC without permission
- Talking loudly during or at the end of any board if the player is unhappy about his/her partner's bid, hand play or defense.


First : Log in , Lobby, at the table and Settings





Second : Bidding, Play, Alert and System

13. • It is strongly recommended to use the chat rather than the vocal chat; the TDs will not take into consideration any vocal explanation if you have any case.




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




If you make a **mistake** or need to **explain your bid further** after you have bid, you can click on the bid and add more text.





