The First Round Robin Completed

The first Round Robin has ben completed, two more await completion before the semi-finals and finals take place.

Two teams managed three victories today: South Africa in the Open Championship and Tunisia in the Women Championship.

In the Open Championship **South** Africa are now the leaders less than two points ahead of **Egypt**. These two teams have opened up a good lead of sixteen points over third-placed **Tunisia**. **Morocco** and **Reunion** are currently fighting for the fourth spot so as to be in the semi-finals and so have a chance of winning a berth to the World Championships in Marrakesh.

In the Women Championship Egypt still lead but Tunisia has moved into second position with South Africa third. A mere four points cover these three teams and Morocco occupy fourth place some nine points behind them.

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




Open Championship Day 1 Session 3 Egypt v Tunisia

The final session on Day1 of the Open Championships saw Egypt face Tunisia – both had won their opening two matches and so winning this match would probably see them top of the standing at the close of play on the first day.


I would never have passed 3NT with West's hand, those hearts are almost certainly useless in 3NT unless partner has ♥AKx and if he has that it is highly unlikely 4♥ will fail. South led a small club to the jack, king and declarer ducked. North continued the suit and when declarer won he played four round of spades, South winning the last. The clubs were now cleared and declarer took his fifth spade. He exited with a small diamond and South took his singleton ace as he had kept two hearts but also two winning clubs and the contract failed by one trick.

North might have had a nasty shock if East had redoubled, not unlikely that the contract would be made with an overtrick. West was not from the school of allowing a seven-card suit to be seen in dummy. On the lead of a diamond declarer inserted the jack and so held his losers to one in the suit and when the king of hearts came down on te second round of the trump suit he made an overtrick and 11 IMPs to Egypt.

The defence started with ace of hearts and another, taken by East with his king and he continued with the jack. Declarer ruffed with the ♠9 and when that held the trump position was revealed. A spade towards the king held, another round exhausted the defenders of their trumps and so declarer had the rest of the tricks which gave him eleven.

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



Declarer established his diamond suit whilst North threw spades from his highest to his lowest. In with the ♠Q South was not hard pressed to understand North's discrds and promptly led his top hearts and another to take the contract two off.

Egypt had much the better of Tunisia and finished up with a whitewash. I am sure Tunisia will up its game against Egypt in the two further confrontations to come.

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




Open Championship Day 2 Session 1 Egypt v Morocco


A double of a freely bid 3NT frequently calls for the lead of dummy's first-bid suit but it is obviously up to partnership agreements. Apparently here it was the case as South led a small club to the queen and jack. North needed to witch to a spade but he made life easy for declarer when he decided upon a diamond as that now meant declarer had five diamond tricks and four heart tricks and so his doubled game.

Two opening hands did not manage to make it to game but looks as though it might have been a ggod thing as both 4 and 3NT can fail and indeed declarer lost the four tricks that would have been duplicated if he was playing at the four-level.

East made an effort and West pushed on to game. To beat the contract South should lead a diamond (a spade would also work – (I'll leave you to work out why) and the North must switch to the ♣10. Unsurprisingly this was beyond the defence and initial lead of the ♣Q saw declarer win with king and rattle off six spade winners before playing a heart to set up the ninth trick. 10 IMP to Egypt.

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

An horrendous misfit, points will be available to those who can brake hardest. West lead a spade which East took and returned the suit. Declarer cashed the ace of trumps and played another, taken by West who gave her partner a spade ruff. Declarer still had a master trump to lose and so finished two light.

I am not convinced South meant 4NT as Blackwood but eventually got the point over that he wanted to play in no-trumps. With diamonds never having been mentioned West elected to lead the ◆K and when it held the trick he continued the suit much to the pleasure of declarer who was even more delighted when he played a third round. He then unblocked the king of hearts and played a top spade and claimed the rest when East took the ace. A remarkable result that gave 11 IMPs to Morocco.

At the end of the match Egypt managed a small victory of 10.91-9.09 BPs,

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

I suspect West was bidding expecting to make a slam not sacrificing against a making one. Declarer lost the two obvious tricks for one off.



You know West is going to game so bidding 3♦ is not going to overly inconvenience him. There must be a case for bidding 4NT over the opening bid and if I had bid 3♦ at my first attempt then I would certainly have bid 4NT at the second attempt showing extreme distribution in the minors with diamonds longer than my clubs – then South would have had

good cause to bid Six Diamonds. Five Spades made the same eleven tricks a gave Egypt 13 IMPs.

There is an oft quoted saying 'The five-level belongs to the opponents'. Why is it oft quoted? because it has a lot of truth in it. Writing -100 instead of +500 is always a painful exercise. In fact you are lucky to be only one off – the fortunate lie of the trump suit restricting losers in that suit to one.

The diamond lead was won in dummy and a trump played. South split her honours and declarer won with the ace and reentered dummy with a heart.

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Another trump and South rose with the king and played another diamond ruffed by declarer who made the good play of cashing the ace of hearts and when the jack fell could draw the last trump and claim. Had the jack not fallen then declarer will cash another high heart and hope they are either 3-3 or the hand with the short hearts does not hold the outstanding trump. 12 IMPs to Egypt.

The lead of a small spade was taken by the ace and the jack of diamonds ran round to the king. The jack of spades held the next trick and when North switched to a club declarer rose with dummy's ace. The ◆10 was covered by the queen and ace. Now declarer blocked the trump suit by cashing the ace and king and so had to win the third round in dummy and when she tried to cash a winning diamond North ruffed in and cashed a winning club for one down.13 IMPs to South Africa.

At the end of a tight hard fought match South Africa edged out Egypt by 11.76-8.24 VPs

Play Links

Each category will have its own playing link (Open teams link—Women teams link .. etc. Play links will be posted to the captains' WhatsApp group and will be also posted to the ABF website at the following link

Click the Match number, official start time or Session open time of your category to join the game. The game will be open to players 30 min before the official start time.

1. Open, Women & Mixed Categories.

For the Semi-final, Final and play-off sessions, It has been decided that:

- The team ranked higher after the RR stage will be the Home team in sessions 2 and 4 in the Semi-final match.
- The team ranked lower after the RR stage will be the Home team in sessions 1 and 3 in the Semi-Final match.
- The team ranked higher after the RR stage will be the Home team in session 2 in the Final or Play-off match.
- If Morocco team qualify to the final match in any category, there will be a 4 Segments play-off match between the semi-final losers to determine the team to qualify to Marrakesh.

2. All Africa Pairs tie-break procedure

If two pairs or more have the same cumulative score after the end of the 2nd session or 4th Session, the tie shall be broken as follows:

- A. The pair with the higher score in the 2nd / 4th session shall determine the final ranking.
- B. Mutual boards between the tied pairs if applicable -

3. Teams Events ... Last RR

The last Round Robin for all categories shall be done according to the final ranking of the teams in the previous played rounds.

8. Time delay and hesitation

- It is very important to know that the TDs have the tools to produce a board report which includes the time for each bid / play by each player, so please be bare that in mind when calling the TD for a possible hesitation or before denying it.
- It is also very important to know that the TDs also have the tools to produce a session time report which includes the exact time taken by each player in a session, in case of time delay, the penalty will be given according to this report.

9. Home & Visiting teams

- When you log in to the RealBridge game (using the game link), you will find your team name written on one of the Tables.
- All team members are required to sit at their table (all together) in Pairs NS and EW, later on, when we start the session, the software will automatically move the EW pairs between the tables according to the schedule of play.
- In the schedule of play you will find Home team (the team mentioned first) and Visiting team (the team mentioned second)
- NO LINE-UP will be needed from the teams, the visiting team has to sit first at their table (in Pairs NS and EW), minimum 10 min before the official start time, and the Home team has the right to have a look at the visiting team and sit its pairs accordingly.

10. Headphones / Earphones

In order to minimize the noise in the venue as much as possible...

- It is mandatory for each player to have his own headphone / earphone which is connected to his device during play
- Use the table chat / private chat as much as possible and don't use vocal chat.
- Any vocal explanation will not be taken into the TD consideration in any case.
- You need to be very careful when using the table chat as you might give an unauthorized information to your partner which could results in adjusted score by the TD.

11. Kibitzers

- Kibitzers are not allowed by any means at 1) the playing venue, 2) RealBridge online playing room.
- All players are required to immediately leave the playing area when they finish their session, players are also kindly asked to keep their seats and not roam around the playing area.

We must act as if we were playing these championships "live", therefore, the following is strictly forbidden during play:

- Mobile phones and any other electronic devices, Mobile phones will be collected and there will be a regular check each session by the monitor.
- Eating (even if only biscuits)
- Drinking Alcohol
- Smoking
- Going to the WC without permission
- Talking loudly during or at the end of any board if the player is unhappy about his/her partner's bid, hand play or defense.

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

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

Second: Bidding, Play, Alert and System

13. At the start of any session, All the team members are required to be seated at the same table (Table with the <u>team name label</u>), the system will automatically move the EW pairs to the opponents table when we start the session and will send them back to their home table when both tables finish playing the boards.

- It is strongly recommended to use the chat rather than the vocal chat; the TDs will not take into consideration any vocal explanation if you have any case.

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













When you are at Full Screen mode

- 3. Make bid



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









If you make a **mistake** or need to **explain your bid further** after you have bid, you can click on the bid and add more text.
