The End of The Round Robins

Today will see the end of the Round Robin series. The top four in both competitions will compete in semi-finals and the winners of those will compete to become Champions of Africa. With Morocco hosting the World Championships two more teams will represent Africa at the World Championships in Marrakesh. These will be the two finalists. Should Morocco reach the finals then the two losing semi-finalists will play a match to decide which of them will represent Africa.

With only three matches remaining in the Round Robin portion of the championships in the Open South Africa had two very big wins plus beat their nearest rivals, Egypt and now have a cushion of over thirty VPs. Tunisia are only 7 VPs behind in third place.

In the Women event Egypt have regained the lead over South Africa but by less than 5 VPs and these two will meet again later today and that match may well decide who finishes at the top of the standings. Tunisia are 11 VPs back in third.

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




Open Championship Day 3 Session 3 South Africa v Tunisia

At the end of Day Three the first and third placed teams in the Open Championship came together: South Africa and Tunisia.


East's Four Diamonds suggested there were some values opposite and that West should choose his best suit – but probably orientated to the majors. When West knew that there were some values opposite he bid what he thought he could make. On the diamond lead declarer won and drew trumps. The fate of the slam was now in the hands of the spade suit, it needed to bring in four tricks. Declare started with the jack that was covered by the king and ace. He came back to hand with a diamond ruff and ran the ♠9 – unlucky. His play would have worked if North had ♠K10x or ♠K10xx and would only lose when South had the \$10 doubleton. If they had found their way to Six Spades then after the expected diamond lead you can afford to lose a trump trick as you get one back by ruffing a diamond,

I wonder if East-West's agreement ran to Stayman in this position, if so then there may have been a chance to reach Six Spades. After the lead of a diamond declarer won and cashed six rounds of clubs which saw South discard his two spades and now it was trivial for declarer to pick up the spade suit for three overtricks. 11 IMPs to South Africa

West needed some form of Exclusion Blackwood he could use at a low level so they could still stop at the five-level. But ordinary Blackwood showed two aces opposite and the probability was that one of them would be the heart ace West wisely settled for just the minor suit game. On the lead of the ace of clubs declarer gave up the two missing aces to claim eleven tricks.

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

An unusual misunderstanding fora well-established partnership but gives us a record breaking flouting of Burn's Law. The play was not pretty and need not detain us except to say that the contract failed by four tricks. 14 IMPs to Tunisia.

East chose his singleton club for the opening lead, covered by the jack, queen and ace. The ace of trumps exposed the expected 4-0 break. There is no legitimate way to make the contract but decarer took the best chance, taking three rounds of trumps finishing in hand but leaving a trump entry to hand. The king of clubs, if it held the trick then the contract was safe but East ruffed, led a spade to partner's ace and the jack came back covered by the queen and king. East now had to lead a diamond but chose instead to try and cash the ♠10 which allowed declarer to claim the rest of the tricks. Did the Three Spades bid promise four spades?



The play was identical for the first five tricks but now East, after ruffing the club, switched to a diamond taken by West who then played ace and another spade to take the contract one off. 10 IMPs to South Africa.

At the end of the match South Africa had beaten Tunisia 16.56–3.42 VPs and so remained at the top.

The following board saw Nada Wattar to be the only person to play in Six Hearts.

On the lead of a trump, declarer won and played ace of clubs and another to ruff in dummy. Dummy's second top trump was cashed and a spade played to the king in hand. Now another club was ruffed and when the suit broke 3-3 she could return to hand via a diamond ruff, draw the last trump and cash the established clubs for a well-bid and played slam.

Someone said it would not be made on a diamond lead as that would force North prematurely. The answer is that the slam can be made but it is tricky. The basic plan is to give up one club so only one needs to be ruffed and make up the shortfall with a second diamond ruff. The timing is crucial and I will leave it to you, dear reader, to work out exactly how it should be done. If you succeed, bravo.

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





The ace was cashed and declarer, perhaps with a sense of humour played another diamond to East. His heart return allowed declarer to finish up with ten tricks. Same as the no-trump contract in the other room but in one room it was played by E/W and the other N/S. You will not see that again in a hurry.8 IMPs to South Africa

In a match that saw little in the way of swings South Africa edged out Egypt 11.76 – 8.24 VPs.

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





All times quoted within the Bulletins are GMT:

Morocco and Tunisia are one hour ahead.

South Africa is two hours ahead.

Egypt and Kenya are three hours ahead and

Reunion is four hours ahead.

So at 2.00 p.m. it is 3.00 p.m. in Morocco and Tunisia, 4.00 p.m. in South Africa and Egypt, 5.00 p.m. in Kenya and 6.00 p.m. in Reunion.

Play Links

Click the Match number, official start time or Session open time of your category to join the game. The game will be open to players 30 min before the official start time.

1. Open, Women & Mixed Categories.

For the Semi-final, Final and play-off sessions, It has been decided that:

- The team ranked higher after the RR stage will be the Home team in sessions 2 and 4 in the Semi-final match.
- The team ranked lower after the RR stage will be the Home team in sessions 1 and 3 in the Semi-Final match.
- The team ranked higher after the RR stage will be the Home team in session 2 in the Final or Play-off match.
- If Morocco team qualify to the final match in any category, there will be a 4 Segments play-off match between the semi-final losers to determine the team to qualify to Marrakesh.

2. All Africa Pairs tie-break procedure

If two pairs or more have the same cumulative score after the end of the 2nd session or 4th Session, the tie shall be broken as follows:

- A. The pair with the higher score in the 2nd / 4th session shall determine the final ranking.
- B. Mutual boards between the tied pairs if applicable -

The last Round Robin for all categories shall be done according to the final ranking of the teams in the previous played rounds.

8. Time delay and hesitation

- It is very important to know that the TDs have the tools to produce a board report which includes the time for each bid / play by each player, so please be bare that in mind when calling the TD for a possible hesitation or before denying it.
- It is also very important to know that the TDs also have the tools to produce a session time report which includes the exact time taken by each player in a session, in case of time delay, the penalty will be given according to this report.

9. Home & Visiting teams

- When you log in to the RealBridge game (using the game link), you will find your team name written on one of the Tables.
- All team members are required to sit at their table (all together) in Pairs NS and EW, later on, when we start the session, the software will automatically move the EW pairs between the tables according to the schedule of play.
- In the schedule of play you will find Home team (the team mentioned first) and Visiting team (the team mentioned second)
- NO LINE-UP will be needed from the teams, the visiting team has to sit first at their table (in Pairs NS and EW), minimum 10 min before the official start time, and the Home team has the right to have a look at the visiting team and sit its pairs accordingly.

10. Headphones / Earphones

In order to minimize the noise in the venue as much as possible...

- It is mandatory for each player to have his own headphone / earphone which is connected to his device during play
- Use the table chat / private chat as much as possible and don't use vocal chat.
- Any vocal explanation will not be taken into the TD consideration in any case.
- You need to be very careful when using the table chat as you might give an unauthorized information to your partner which could results in adjusted score by the TD.

11. Kibitzers

- Kibitzers are not allowed by any means at 1) the playing venue, 2) RealBridge online playing room.
- All players are required to immediately leave the playing area when they finish their session, players are also kindly asked to keep their seats and not roam around the playing area.

We must act as if we were playing these championships "live", therefore, the following is strictly forbidden during play:

- Mobile phones and any other electronic devices, Mobile phones will be collected and there will be a regular check each session by the monitor.
- Eating (even if only biscuits)
- Drinking Alcohol
- Smoking
- Going to the WC without permission
- Talking loudly during or at the end of any board if the player is unhappy about his/her partner's bid, hand play or defense.

4. If you can't see your video then you need to allow your browser to use your cam and mic, do as follows to allow it



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

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

Second: Bidding, Play, Alert and System

13. At the start of any session, All the team members are required to be seated at the same table (Table with the <u>team name label</u>), the system will automatically move the EW pairs to the opponents table when we start the session and will send them back to their home table when both tables finish playing the boards.

14. Private chat and Table chat

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
When you are at Full Screen mode

- 3. Make bid




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




If you make a **mistake** or need to **explain your bid further** after you have bid, you can click on the bid and add more text.
