WELCOME TO THE 20th BFAME CHAMPIONSHIPS AT AMMAN

Welcome to **Amman, Jordan** for the **20th BFAME** (Bridge Federation of Asia & Middle East) Championships to be held at **Bristol Hotel, Amman** from **Sunday, 23rd June 2019 till Sunday 30th June, 2019.** The championship is being organized by **Jordan Bridge Federation** under the leadership of its dynamic President **Mr. Ghassan Ghanem** and **Mr. Bahjat Al Majali**, the BFAME Vice President and chief organizer. This will be the fifth time, **Amman** is hosting the BFAME Championships, which is being held under the patronage of His Royal Highness Prince Feisal bin Al Hussein, President of the Jordan Olympic Committee.

The organizers warmly welcome all participants & officials who are participating in this prestigious Zonal Championships.

BFAME is the **Zone-4** of World Bridge Federation (**WBF**) with a membership of 12 countries. Seven teams in the **Open event**, Four teams in the **Women event**, Six teams in the **Seniors event** (should be aged 61 years in 2019) and five teams in the **Mixed event** would be vying for the coveted **Zakaria Adamjee Memorial Trophy, Vinodini Goenka Trophy, Nawzad Shaker Trophy** and **Mixed Teams Trophy** respectively.

The Open teams will be playing a double round-robin (7 rounds per round robin), Women teams will play quadruple round robin (3 matches per round robin) and Seniors and Mixed teams will play triple round-robin (5 rounds per round robin). Two to Three matches per day of 16 boards each will be played in all the events (to be decided in the 1^{st} BFAME meeting). Semi finals of 64 boards (16 x 4) would be played to determine the finalists in the Open event, while the top two teams in other events would go straight to the finals. The final of each event will be of 32 boards.

The Finalists in each category, i.e. two teams from the Open event for the **44th Bermuda Bowl**, two teams from the Women for the **22nd Venice Cup**, two teams from the Seniors event for the **10th d'Orsi Seniors Trophy** and two teams from the Mixed event for the **1st Mixed Trophy** would be representing this Zone and their respective countries to the World Championship at Wuhan, China from 14th till 28th September 2019.

The Championships will be conducted by efficient and competent BFAME technical personnel headed by **Mr. Waleed El-Menyawi**, the Head TD and Operation Manager and **Mr. Ihsan Qadir**, the Chief Tournament Director to ensure highest standards of international Bridge competitions. Scoring will be done through Bridge Mates and results and daily bulletins would be uploaded on the BFAME web site **http://www.bridgewebs.com/bfame/** throughout the championship. Each day, we will have Vugraph of 2 matches per session on BBO. Players will have to fill the electronic line-up before each match in all the events.

The opening Ceremony will be held at 1130 hours today (23rd June 2019). Professor Khaled Al Atyat, the representative of His Royal Highness Prince Feisal bin Al Hussein, President of the Jordan Olympic Committee will be the Chief Guest and will grace the opening ceremony. The Championships will get away to brisk start with one session of Friendship Pairs at 1715 Hrs. The Victory Banquet and Prize Distribution function will be held on 30th June evening at the conclusion of the play. We are confident that all bridge players will carry happy memories from this event.



ABOUT JORDAN

The official name of Jordan is the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan. Jordan's currency is the Jordanian Dinar (JOD). Jordan has a combination of Mediterranean and arid desert climates, with Mediterranean climates prevailing in the north and west of the country, while the majority of the country is desert.

Jordan has a rich historic background, both from the religious and cultural grounds. Jordan is home to the ancient city of Petra. Known as "The Rose City", it is famous for its unique architecture carved directly into the rock face. It is also a UNESCO World Heritage Site and one of the new 7 Wonders of the World. The final scenes from the movie "Indiana Jones" and "The Last Crusade" were filmed at Petra. The lowest point on Earth in terms of dry land is the shore of the Dead Sea in Jordan. It lies at 1,378ft (420m) beneath sea level. The ruins of Petra and the Dead Sea make Jordan a popular tourist destination.

Jordan's most famous national park is **Wadi Rum**, where you can spend the night amid the silent desert expanse at a simple Bedouin Beit Shar (goat-hair tent) encampment The famous movie *Lawrence of Arabia* was shot at Wadi Rum.

Amman is the capital and most populous city of Jordan as well as the country's economic, political and cultural centre. The city of Amman originally built on 7 hills has now expanded to more than 17 and presents a picturesque skyline. Amman has scores of hotels of international repute, a proof of tourist influx, along with plenty of good restaurants, which offer some fine dining. Shopping is delightful and one ought to bargain while purchasing indigenous products from the cottage industry. Pleasant weather combined with traditional Arab hospitality makes the visit to this country truly exciting and memorable.

The culture of Jordan follows **Arab** traditions as the Kingdom is in the heart of the Middle East. The official language is **Arabic** although English is widely used in commerce, government and taught at public and private schools.

Jordan is known as an extremely friendly country, where you'll hear **Ahlan wa sahlan**! or "Welcome!" quite often.

The venue of our Championships, **Bristol Amman Hotel**, is a 5 star Boutique Hotel situated on Abdul Rahman Alawi Street close to the Al Baraka Mall in central business district of Amman. In addition to the hotel's own restaurants, a good restaurant in the vicinity is known as Fame Restaurant, which one could visit. The vibrant downtown Shmeisani area is not so far, which has some popular eating joints catering international and Arab cuisine.

In 1993, Ghassan Ghanem the Secretary General of the Jordan Bridge Association (JBA) at the time, returned from Port Louis – Mauritius and submitted his report to the Board of JBA. Among the concluding recommendations of the report was a proposal to host the Eighth BFAAME Championships in Jordan in the summer / autumn / winter of 1995.

It was a challenging proposal from the timing considerations; JBA was barely surviving the construction of its building, which had costed a fortune at that time.

The President of JBA Bahjat Majali realized the good opportunity and thoroughly studied the proposal with the board members.

There were conflicting opinions amongst them but they liked the idea of hosting the Championships in Jordan. Nevertheless, Bahjat had his own concerns, "If we are going to do it, it should be well organized, presenting excellent performance, with a warm welcoming environment. This also meant providing state of the art equipment, bringing in top directors, operators, editors and commentators. Public figures and Governmental institutions were to be involved. In brief, it should be unforgettable", Bahjat told the Board, "and that means huge efforts, lots of money and a more detailed proposal introducing potential participation, programs, budget, financing and human resources. If we can't achieve all our objectives, we should not take the challenge." Bahjat persisted. In our dictionary, that was a big yes.

We both enjoy working together, especially when we join our forces with the energetic team of the other board members and working committees' members with the support of Mrs. Nawzad Shaker, the Honorary President of JBA. It was a big success with a record participation and world class organization as indicated by everyone.

We hosted the BFAME Championships for the second time in 2003 at a very short notice, and it seems that we became addicted! We hosted the Championships again in 2009 and 2015, and we hope you will enjoy the new four events format of the Championships here at Bristol in Amman.

Through the years, we also had the pleasure to participate in BFAME Championships in many other cities in the zone. - 2. In the subsequent Round-Robin, the same draw as of the first round-robin will continue with new Team Nos. being allocated to Teams, based on their rankings at the end of previous round-robin
- 3. There will be 2 Round-Robins in OPEN, 4 Round Robins in WOMEN and 3 Round-Robins in MIXED & SENIORS event.

BFAME Bridge Championships – A Brief Summary

BFAME, ZONAL CONFERENCE OF WBF ZONE-4

FORMATION AND GROWTH

The Bridge Federation of Asia & Middle East (BFAME) was established in 1977 when, having earmarked the geographical area West of the Bay of Bengal to the Mediterranean and designating it as Zone 4, the WBF Executive Council assigned the task of uniting the NBOs of the aforesaid jurisdictional territory into a ZC (Zonal Conference) to the then Co-Chairman of the WBF Zoning Committee, the late James O'Sullivan of Australia. Upon effective contacts with the NBO of Bangladesh, India, Pakistan and Sri Lanka, the genial and duty-conscious WBF Zoning Committee Co-Chairman provisionally commissioned Zone 4 and its ZC, later christened as the Bridge Federation of Asia & the Middle East, at a meeting held in November 1978 at Maurya Sheraton Hotel New Delhi, India. It was also at this meeting that the BFAME officers were appointed.

After nearly a year's hectic work by the BFAME Secretariat, the new zonal federation submitted its application for the requisite approval of the WBF Executive Council at its meeting held in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil in October 1979. The BFAME Secretary, who presented the application in person, succeeded in securing ratification of the BFAME subject to fulfilment of certain requirements of WBF Constitution and By-Laws. upon compliance with these However, requirements, the BFAME was accorded the status of a ZC, in good standing, in the WBF Executive Council meetings held in Valkenburg, Holland, in Sep 1980.

Starting as a toddling Zonal body with 4 NBOs having less than 5000 bridge players as their registered members the BFAME has, over the last nearly 30 years, grown in size and strength. At Present it has within its folds NBOs 13 countries of South Asia, Middle East and West Asia with over 15,000 competitive bridge players as their members. These are Bahrain, Bangladesh, India, Jordan, Kuwait, Nepal, Pakistan, Palestine, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Sri Lanka, UAE, and Syria.

In 1983, pursuant to a resolution of BFAME Council, and upon approval of WBF Executive Council, the geographical jurisdiction of Zone 4 was extended to the continent of Africa and name of its Zonal Conference was modified to Bridge Federation of Africa Asia and the Middle East (BFAAME) with 22 member NBOs. However, subsequently in 2000, with the formation and commissioning of a new/separate zone for the continent of Africa in accordance with the aspiration of the African NBOs – Zone 8 and its ZC named as African Bridge Federation, BFAME reverted back to its original name and jurisdictional area having 13 NBOs as its members.

The BFAME and BFAAME have sponsored and successfully conducted 18 biennial Zonal Championships till now. It is noteworthy that these championships were conducted in line with international standards set by the WBF, with proper Conditions of Contest governing these championships and screens, Vu-graph and other technical infrastructure in operation.

Through its past President and now President Emeritus, who is a member of WBF Executive Council for the last 40 years plus and is also WBF Vice-President since 1991, BFAME/Zone 4 has the distinction of making substantial contribution towards the growth & progress of bridge worldwide and the future well being of the WBF and its member NBOs. In this connection, institution of WBF Infrastructure Development Programme and initiative for recognition of bridge as a sport by International Olympic Committee (IOC) stand out.

Here is one hilarious deal played by the editor himself from the Shree Cement Tournament held in April 2019 at Kolkata, which came up in the Session-3 of the Open Pairs Elimination-2 round.

As this was the last session of the day, the players were rushing back home and one of my team mates asked me the result on board 18. Remembering the board well, as it has fetched me a sure shot top, I curiously asked what happened on their table and they informed that their opponents played in 4H going one down

That was a surprise for me as I had played the contract in 6H making. When asked, what happened on their table, I was informed that after two passes, West opened the hand with four hearts and North led the spade ten. South won with the queen, cashed his spade Ace and played back a spade. West worried about the possible ruff by North, ruffed with Heart Jack, hoping that hearts will behave. He now went to dummy with a low heart and finessed the AQ, which lost to the Kand with heart breaking badly was forced to give one heart to North for one down.

We play a weak No-Trump (11-14) when nonvulnerable and my partner tried the stunt with the east hand. I transferred to hearts by bidding 4D, which North doubled and my partner now fearing about his bad opening passed but I took it otherwise.

As the redouble would have shown diamond control, which I knew he does not have, I considered that I want little in black suits from his hand for the slam and I bid it. The contract should have been 2 or 3 down but for no reason North found the lead of his singleton &K. I won in hand, played to HQ, back to hand with diamond Ace and reeled of hearts. Poor South played the S9 showing interest in spade but was squeezed in the last four card position. As he had to retain 3 clubs, he threw AQ on my last heart and I end played him by playing a spade to his A. Though he tried *****10 now but I won in dummy with ♣Q and won the last 2 tricks with ♣9 & ♠J.

FROM THE DESK OF "HEAD TD"

General Points:

- 1. A change of players, pairs or partnerships can be made only at the beginning of a match or a session.
- 2. Every participating partnership in the Championships must complete, accurately and legibly, two WBF/BFAME Convention Card (with supplementary sheets as appropriate).
- 3. After the line-up is known to the players, teams are not allowed to change their own line-ups unless they have a valid reason and after the approval of the Head TD / C.TD and the other team as well.
- 4. Both members of a partnership must adopt the same methods in the auction and in their carding.
- 5. The use of Mobile phone in the playing area is totally prohibited (no exception), a severe penalty will be given for each infraction and if the infraction is repeated, it will be reported to the Organizing committee for more penalties. <u>Mobiles should not be brought to the playing area, otherwise should be handed</u> to the T.D. in charge before play starts.
- 6. Random checking will be in order at any time during the play with the above penalty applied.
- 7. Smoking is not allowed in the playing floor/Area, a severe penalty will be given for such infraction and if the infraction is repeated, it will be reported to the Organizing committee e for more penalties, the playing area includes the toilets.
- 8. Players who would like to go to the toilets must inform the T.D. in charge, who will provide an escort with the player to the toilets and before going to the toilets the player must empty his/her pockets, bag, etc.; and the above mentioned rules will be applied, if appropriate.
- 9. Spectators are allowed in the open room but they must enter the room before the play of the session. If they leave the room they will not be allowed to come back.
- 10. Players are not allowed to watch their own team and also no mobiles or smoking are allowed in the playing arena. Those found breaking the rules will be taken away from the playing area and with the approval of the C.T.D. will never be allowed to enter the playing area for the rest of the championship.
- 11. Non playing captains are allowed to watch their own team in the closed or the open rooms with the provisions mentioned in (5-8).
- 12. Screen regulations shall be followed with written explanations and proper alert procedure.

Alerting Procedures

Players who participate in The BFAME zonal championship are expected to protect themselves to a large extent by asking their screen mates in case of any clarification required. Full disclosure is vital. Alerting should be done properly; see screen regulations, and explanations are given in writing.

Policy:

The following classes of calls should be alerted:

(1) Conventional calls.

(2) Those calls which have special meanings or which are based on or lead to special understanding between partners. (See Law 40(b)).

(3) Non- forcing jump changes of suit responses to opening bids or overcalls, and nonforcing new suit responses by un-passed hand to an opening bid one of a suit; "negative free bids".

(4) Opening bid of 1. must be alerted, if it may show 2 cards.

(5) Precision 1 \pm / \Rightarrow systems must be alerted as well as their conventional responses as each time they occur.

(6) For strong club/diamond systems all natural bidding should be alerted as showing a maximum of certain points.

(7) Conventional special doubles and redoubles.

As there is No Appeals committee in BFAME, a review will be asked instead.

REVIEW PROCEDURE

- The BFAME shall appoint a list of Reviewers for the Head Tournament Director to choose from according to the case. When the tournament director notifies players of a decision, they will be told of their right to seek a review. See Section "Protest Time" for the time limit for seeking a review.
- The Reviewer will check that the Tournament Director has gathered the necessary evidence of what occurred when the infraction arose. The Reviewer will then need to be satisfied that the correct law was applied and that other Tournament Directors, C.TD and H.TD were consulted where appropriate.
- In matters involving the judgment that was exercised by a player following unauthorized information, incorrect explanation or failure to alert, the Reviewer will clarify that suitable players have been asked appropriate questions to enable a judgmental view to be obtained. Finally the Reviewer will check that the ruling that was issued based upon all the Information available to the Tournament Directors was within the bounds of reasonableness.
- The fact that the Reviewer might have determined a slightly different ruling would not be good reason for the ruling to be varied. In the event that the process had not been followed properly in some material way, the Reviewer will ask the Head Tournament Director to correct the failings and issue a new ruling

PROTEST TIME

In respect of scores the protest time of all matches played in a day ends at the starting time of the first match on the day following, and in respect of the final day's play two hours after the official finishing time of the final match but, in any case, not later than the official starting time of the Closing Ceremony.

The time for a request for a Tournament Director ruling or for a review of a ruling already received ends 30 minutes after the end of the round. A fee of \$100 will be paid for the case to be reviewed; which will be forfeited, if the Reviewer decides that the request has no basis.

Smoking in the playing area, is strictly prohibited and will attract heavy penalties.

SUBMITTING YOUR LINE-UP

It is mandatory for Captains to give their Lineup through the Electronic LINE-UP Software. Each Captain will be provided with a PASSWORD for accessing the software at the Captain's meeting.

Regulations for Electronic Line-Ups

The Line-ups must be submitted electronically in accordance with the details below. Failure of a captain to submit his line-up in a timely fashion shall result in fines as follows:

- The line-ups during the round robin must be submitted by both teams no later than 15 minutes after the end of the previous round; teams will not know the line-up of their opponents (blind line-up). The line-up for the first round must be given in accordance with the decision taken in the Captains Meeting.
- In the KO phase the team to line-up first must submit its line-up no later than 15 minutes after the end of the previous session. The second team must then submit its line-up no later than 20 minutes after the end of the previous session or no later than 5 minutes after the submission of the first lineup, whichever is latest.
- Line-ups are to be submitted in a dedicated area, with computers as designated by the Operations Director. However, each team will have its own password protected page on the website (www.toygarabi.com) to enable them to use the software with their own laptops / mobile phones.
- The time of the Line-Up will be recorded automatically by the system, and penalties for late line-ups will be mandatory. An official clock will be set in the playing area for the purpose of showing the official time.

- In case of 4 or 3 teams, matches will alternate with 3 or 2 each day.
- In case of more than 8 teams, matches will alternate 4 or 3 each day.
- Finals: 32 boards (16x2) for all four categories on last day.
- Format and playing conditions are subject to approval in the first BFAME Council Meeting to be held on Sunday 23rd June'19.
