### **Review of the Year**

**Our Bridge** : Well, Carol, is quite right we have stuttered our way through the last year with Face to Face sessions, RealBridge sessions and Bridge Base Online sessions, the latter with the support of Ashby Bridge Club. The best news is that we have certainly doubled our participation levels, chiefly through our online ventures. And, the even better news is that you have returned in numbers to Face to Face Bridge. We have been pleased to welcome George and Andy; Mary and Janet; Janet and Wendy; Pat and Terry and last but not least Dave Wenham to the club. Sadly, we have lost some members with either ill health or difficulty in making the sessions. However, we hope to bring in new members by offering bridge tuition for a beginners programme in September.

Our Monday evening sessions on RealBridge via BBVA – Bagworth/Bosworth Virtual Alliance is doing well and obviously fulfills a need. We are drawing in players from different clubs including Ashby, The County and Loughborough and usually get six tables. No membership is charged as we are not a club but do get in table money. This brings in a little money but we

are really only trying to cover the fee costs of RealBridge and we share any profit equally between Bosworth and ourselves.

This year we are offering a competition with a trophy 'The Jubilee Cup' for random pairs and we shall introduce a knock out competition for 22/23 for the first time.

The 70%+ average – yes, we still have it and have had some great scores with the weird deals that our dealing machine as well as online manage to come up with! Some partnerships coped with amazing success to gain average scores of over 70%. They get a mention in dispatches on the website and a free week in face to face bridge!

Whilst playing on BBO we had the facility via the Ashby Club to achieve the English Bridge Union master points. This involves a payment of 56p to the EBU and County Bridge Association. Most of our members are already EBU members and have access to their resources. Whilst we have previously voted against joining the EBU because of the costs and the risk of impact on the friendliness of the club, we always bring this up for futher consideration at the AGM so we shall be voting on this.

**Committee** : Your committee of five : Carol, John, Shelagh, Roger and Anne have met four times during the year for virtual meetings via zoom and the minutes are in the members area of the web site under documents. A 'Whats App' group has been formed by them for exchange of ideas and subsequent actions agreed both through the meetings and Whats App discussions. Much time was spent in keeping pace with Covid legislation masks or not, refreshments or not, social distancing etc. Roger as our Health and Safety lead was kept busy! Additionally, we acquired our dealing machine and we now have several committee members who can do this on a rotational basis. It's been fun sorting this out! Roger kindly donated an old laptop to travel with the dealing machine so it's all quite straight forward now.


Four of the committee members, Anne, John, Shelagh and Roger have agreed to continue in their current role but Carol, as Chair has completed her three year cycle and in line with our constitution. However, we shall not be losing her expertise as she has agreed to remain on the committee, looking after the directing and sorting premises. This means that we need to elect a new chair person and a new committee member to look at social events refreshments etc. Nominations have been received so please come along to the AGM and vote.



**Members :** Our membership figures remain at 40+ but it is composed of different people. We have been pleased to welcome some players from different clubs along with some able players who just joined us living locally and we have lost some. The reasons for their leaving are many and varied.... some withdrew from bridge altogether or find the prospect of returning to face to face bridge daunting after covid, some for health reasons or transport difficulties.

With the current membership fee of £10.00 p.a., the committee are proposing a reduction of this to £5.00 per annum. The extra charge over the last four years was to help to purchase equipment and we always agreed to review this. We believe that the time is right to make the change. Our online sessions, currently on RealBridge only, have been made viable with support from other club's players and we are most appreciative of them but do not charge membership as this is purely a playing platform, open to all following payment of table fees.

At the AGM, we shall ask you to vote on the subscription rates and the table fees



**Equipment :** Our biggest purchase has been the new dealing machine. This was secured with the aid of the Parish and Community fund where we were successful in our grant application. We arranged the launch event and postponed it at least three times as Covid requirements changed. However, we were pleased to welcome Councillor Martin Cartwright. He did us proud with quite a long speech and he was fascinated with the machine. You did us proud too with a great attendance. We purchased additional boards so that we could deal four weeks of boards at a time and thanks to Roger we have a laptop which is set up to link with the dealing machine. We try to keep pace with extra equipment to stay ahead of the number of players and so have purchased an extra table, set of bidding boxes and two additional scoring tablets

### **Treasurers Comments**

2021/22 financially has been a very successful year considering the breaks in face to face bridge due to Covid. Our main sources of income are:

- Table fees, currently at £2.00 per session and generating 1091.50 in 21/2 although we expect this to increase in 22/23 assuming that Face to Face bridge is not interupted again;
- Online bridge via BBO accessed via support from Ashby generating £373.20 which we do not anticipate in 22/23 assuming Face to Face bridge continues
- Online Bridge via Real Bridge via the Bagworth and Bosworth Virtual Alliance generating £691.98
- The weekly raffle generating a profit of £349.00 as well as some fun!
- Membership fees have generated an income of £390, currently £10.00p.a. However, we are proposing a reduction in this to £5.00 p.a so we can expect the income from

this to be around £200 in 22/23.

The club had been able to afford the purchase additonal equiupment to keep pace with membership and playing needs as outlined in the section above. Our primary financial objective for 2021/2 was to build a more secure financial base and we have achieved this as can be seen in the carry forward line of nearly £1400 into 22/3 in comparison to the £398 the previous year.

2021/2 has seen the introduction of online payments which has been very successful and easy to manage so thanks to you all, our members. Some people are unable to do this and we will take cash or cheque from them. However, this incurrs an extra transaction charge from the banks now. We try to minimise this by reducing the number of bank visits we have still incurred an additional change for 21/22 of £27.69.

The pattern of our finances looks a little inconsistent in the last three years as we purchase equipment to get ourselves established and with the frequent interuption via Covid. We are looking for more consistency in 22/23 but we are sure you are pleased to see that we are in a strong position financially to carry our club forward. We shall be able to meet all planned expenditure and costs arisng from room rental, insurances, licences, refreshments etc. We make special thanks to our auditor Richard Chantler who kindly audited are accounts quickly and efficiently

## **Bagworth Whistlestop Bridge Group Mission**

### Our mission is to share and spread the game of bridge to local people for their enjoyment, health and well being in a friendly, safe and comfortable environment

#### Principles / Aims

- To establish a local bridge group playing duplicate bridge for members' health and well -being and their enjoyment.
- To create a setting for social but challenging bridge and with a friendly and convivial atmosphere.
- I To work alongside and with other clubs for their enhancement and not to their detriment to broaden the range of bridge playing opportunities available.
- To build resources to enable an excellent as well as a self-sufficient playing environment
- To promote the group to other clubs and the wider bridge playing and non-bridge playing community.
- I To draw in grants to build resources for the club.

### Planning Proposals for 2021-22

- 1. To recommence 'face to face' bridge as soon as it is safe and legal to do so.
- 2. To maximise the confidence of players returning to play 'face to face' bridge by adherence to general covid secure principles and those of the Community Centre by updating our risk assessment and consulting with members.
- 3. To build a more secure financial base to ensure adequate funds for equipment replacement by maintaining and extending current participation levels.
- 4. To use and demonstrate the use of the new dealing machine and hold a celebratory event to mark the grant from Hinckley and Bosworth.
- 5. To deliver the planning improvers programme.
- 6. To deliver a 'beginners' bridge programme using a combination of online and face to face learning.
- 7. To maintain the friendly and sociable atmosphere in the club by holding social events eg Christmas party, celebratory return to bridge party
- 8. Research the viability of an online session of bridge as well as our regular Thursday face to face session and if feasible implement.

#### How did we do?

Planning and Performance Review against 2021-22 targets.

Well, in the scheme of things probably not that badly as we moved from online bridge, then to face to face, then to online only and then to face to face and online. People generally felt confident and comfortable as we returned to face-to-face bridge with all the precautions undertaken. We have more people able to set up for a face-to-face session, we have a rota for the dealing machine. We have completed the improvers programme and we have brought more people up to speed with online play. We did check out with you the feasibility of an additional online session which we now currently enjoy on a Monday evening. We have set up one club competition the random pairs and will follow this up by a knockout competition. We have completely failed in developing social activities, there was no Christmas Partygate in Bagworth. However, thanks to you all we enjoy a sociable and convivial atmosphere in our playing sessions.

We were also unable to provide a beginner's programme We have maintained our links with press and the voluntary sector via regular press releases to profile the club.

#### Plans for 2022/3

- 1. To increase our membership base by providing a beginner's programme
- 2. To improve playing standards at the table by highlighting correct procedures eg alert and announcement.
- 3. To extend the competitions by developing a 'Knock out' programme
- 4. To expand our social activities
- 5. To profile the club amongst other voluntary sector organisations
- 6. To maintain a healthy financial profile
- 7. To secure additional equipment as need arises
- 8. To raise standards of play for our existing players by providing some further Improvers workshops
- 9. To review the scoring system using bridgetabs with other options suitable for our tablets and website
