## Save the Date : A grand day out : the details

It's not too late to join us! Mary Weeks has been in touch was various coach companies for our Stamford visit and has the best deal from Roberts coaches!.

They will provide a 37 seater coach '(no toilets)' leaving the community centre at 9.00am on Friday April 26th arriving in Stamford town centre 10.030am. Friday is market day in Stamford. The coach will then take us to Stamford bridge club 12.45 to play in their afternoon duplicate session at 1.30. The coach will leave at around 4.30 and collect any non bridge playing people from the centre of Stamford. Return time to the community centre will be 6.00-6.30. We ask that you share cars where possible to the Community Centre so that we do not occupy to many spaces. The cost of the coach is £600.00 so we are hoping to get 30 passengerssome for bridge, about 7 tables and some for shopping and visiting Stamford. This should keep the cost at £20.00 perhead and less if we have more. You are welcome to bring along non member friends but we would ask that you book and pay for them to save the extra administrative work required for the invoicing of non members. There will be table fees required for bridge players.
