We are doing well. At our last statement date our funds were at a healthy £2,600. We do not have a deposit account as we do not plan on developing a savings approach but using your funds to cover the necessities of the club to cover our operating costs and replacement costs with some contingency. With this in mind, our treasurer considers that our membership fee and weekly table fee should remain as they are for the forthcoming year 2024-5 and will ask you to vote on this at the AGM.

Our recent purchases have been two new tablets bringing our total to 14. We need 12 for the Swiss teams and we need spares for any critical incident. Interestingly the cost of the tablets hasn't risen since our initial purchase five years ago!

We have also purchased some pens with a screen dibber andwith our logo. We shall be using them for prizes and special events.



We may see some changes in our finances as our new treasurer takes up the reins. He has considered a card machine e.g. izettle and joining the bridge webs invoicing system but has chosen to keep things as they are at the moment as they work very well.
