

Today a man knocked on my door and asked for a small donation towards the local swimming pool, so I gave him a glass of water.





Definition of a Mixed Raise



A <u>Mixed Raise</u> is: any time the opponents open the bidding, and our side makes an overcall, regardless of what their responder does, the partner of the overcaller jumps in the <u>opener's</u> suit.




These are called "jump-cuebids."

A "jump-cuebid" is a Mixed Raise.


Mixed Raises

Remember, they only occur when they open the bidding, not us.



Mixed Raises


A cue bid with a <u>double jump</u> would be a <u>Splinter</u> <u>Bid</u>, showing good support, interest in slam, and a singleton or void in the suit that was cue bid:



Like: ♠AQ32 ♥--- ♦A762 ♠KQ542

- ✓ Good support
- ✓ Slam interest
- ✓ Shortness in the cue bid suit


Another Joke
