




Contract Priorities – The 3 Finger Rule

This rule applies for partscores, games or slams.



But why are major suit fits preferred over NT? They pay 10 points more for a NT contract, don't they?

Because statistically, it is easier to make suit contracts (and overtricks) than in NT, where the opponents get to attack with their suit(s) first!







Another Joke



When you have extra values for game, but not enough for slam, consider playing in 3NT.

You make 11 tricks in 3NT, 4H or 4S.



Why the Exception Works

Example 1: With a total of 33 HCPs, all you lose is the A♣ to get 12 tricks. The contract should be 6NT.

Example 2: With 32 HCPs, you need to gain a trick by ruffing a ♣ or a ♦ to get 12 tricks. The contract should be 6H or 6S.
