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# Time for a Joke

In Russia, it is very difficult to get a car. In fact, only 1 out of every 7 families actually has one. It's a huge bureaucratic process and can take 10 years.

## Exclusion Blackwood



Exclusion Blackwood (aka Voidwood), invented by the late Bobby Goldman (of the Dallas Aces), is a way (once there's an agreed suit) to ask for aces and the K and Q of trumps with a void in your hand.

A jump to a new suit at the 4 or 5 level says, "Partner, I have a void in this new suit. Tell me your number of key cards, not counting this suit."

	North	<u>East</u>	<u>South</u>	<u>West</u>
Example:		1H	Pass	3H
	Pass	4S*	Pass	???

The responses mimic those of Keycard Blackwood (1430):

1<sup>st</sup> bid available (4NT) = 1 or 4 keycards, counting the K♥ as one, but not the A♠. 2<sup>nd</sup> bid available (5C) = 3 or 0 keycards, counting the K♥ as one, but not the A♠. 3<sup>rd</sup> bid available (5D) = 2 keycards, without the Q♥, not counting the A♠. 4<sup>th</sup> bid available (5H) = 2 keycards, with the Q♥, not counting the A♠.

### Exclusion Blackwood

If partner's response doesn't show the Q of trumps or not, you can ask for it by making the cheapest bid that is <u>NOT trumps</u> (that's reserved for getting out).

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North South East West South has 1 or 4 keycards, not **1C** Pass **3C** Pass counting the AS. Example: 4S\* Pass 4NT Pass The cheapest bid outside of clubs 5D\* asks for the QC.

The responses follow of Keycard Blackwood:

Bidding the trump suit (6C) shows no Q♣. 5NT shows the Q♣, but no kings (the K of trumps doesn't count). Bidding any non-trump suit shows the Q♣ and the king in that bid suit.

Rakesh replied, "Actually, I've found many women I wanted to marry, but when I bring them home to meet my parents, my mother doesn't like them."


His friend thinks for a moment and says, "I've got the perfect solution. Just find a girl who's just like your mother."
