Chicago Duplicate Bridge

Welcome to 2025!

It's a new year, and like everything else, costs for Chicago Duplicate Bridge are subject to inflation. Whether it's the cost of soft drinks or maintaining infrastructure, everything costs more. To help offset those costs, the table fee for all "regular" games is now \$14. ACBL charges CDB per player for all games, with an add-on fee for special games that provide additional Masterpoints. Traditionally those additional costs have been passed on as table fees. To keep the fees affordable, CDB's fees for special games will be capped at \$15 regardless of the premium charged by ACBL.

And we have members who like the Thursday game and a few for whom it best fits their schedule. Right now we are not getting consistent attendance so we need your help. Thursday afternoon would be a good time to try playing with a new partner, or to try out new conventions or approaches with your usual partner. Solo Players

All games now guarantee partners, so if you feel like showing up for a game at the last minute, you should do so. As always, the further in advance you let the director know, the better your chances of finding a compatible partner.

Potential Club Move

Partnership Bridge with George (by Matthew)

I have encouraged many people to form at least one serious partnership – you need to have someone you learn with, have frank discussions with, and choose a system and set of conventions together. Both George (Clark) and I play with other people, but we play with each other in top-level events. We play once a week online – and once again we had a couple of public spats using some most ungentlemanly language. We do it because we need to use every mistake at a club game to uncover ten similar mistakes when it matters. Discussions after bridge are how you improve.

In this hand, George was dealer sitting North. Here is the situation after George opened 2C and East bid:





I clicked on the 2S, bid by a BBO robot, and learn that it means "twice rebiddable spades; 9+ points." And the robots typically don't psych. But might they? It certainly looked like it, but talking George into my own twice rebiddable spade suit seemed like it might be a problem.

So what are the agreements here? George and I have clear agreements after interference over a 2C opener. We pass to show a game force (like a 2D bid would be if there were no interference) and we double with a bust (like a 2H bid if there were no interference). And we can bid our own suit, but what to do if the opps have bid my suit? So I have to pass (a oneround forcing bid) and after George bid 3C, I felt I had no option but to try 3N since I couldn't show my spade suit. My thinking was that George would have sat there and wondered what I was smoking if I had bid any number of spades.

And here was the outcome after the initial lead of the H5.

And I don't think I've ever played in 3N holding Q9 vs 7 and won a trick in that suit.

There were arguments about when I should have bid spades as South, and then whether North should pass and leave it in. The consensus was that he as North should probably bid 4C, but it could be right to pass 3N because it looks like the clubs run, right?

Bridge is hard.

Come join us at Teach and Learn on Fridays at CDB. We often have new players who come with little to literally no bridge experience. Don't be afraid that you are "too experienced" or "too new" to benefit from joining the group. If you are looking for more chances to play in a limited-MP game, consider joining our Friday afternoon 750/NLM ((non-Life Master) game.

CDB offers Supervised Play at 10:30 for \$5, followed by a short break for lunch and a shortened (usually 18- or 21-board) 750/NLM game at 12:15. This game now regularly has **4-6 full tables**, so there's a nice spirit of friendly competition. But **you do NOT have to attend the Supervised Play to join the game.** If you come to both, there is no charge for the Supervised Play. This is a great way to practice and see the rules you have learned in actual use. The atmosphere is relaxed and supportive. It's also a great way to meet potential partners, so don't be afraid to come without a partner arranged in advance. Evening Parking at the Dearborn Club

The parking lot behind the building now charges for evening parking, and the attendant is staying later. The club does not benefit if you park in their lot, so we encourage you to explore some of the other options available.

Most on-street parking is free after 5 or 6 pm (in the pay-at-the-box spots). Plymouth Court between Harrison and Polk has many spots that are loading zones during the day and free nights and weekends. Don't park in resident parking without a sticker, and do check the closest box to be sure it is free. We also recommend installing the Spothero app on your phone to find the cheapest public parking in the area.

For those with safety concerns, just call the club and we will send someone to escort you to and from your car. Many evening players offer rides home to those who arrive by public transportation, so safety should not be a concern, particularly since the South Loop is one of the safest neighborhoods in the City of Chicago.
