**Emergency Contact Cards:** To facilitate response to a medical emergency at JSOB, we have a plan to have essential information available for EMTs who arrive on the scene. Blank emergency contact cards are available for you to fill out and give to the Director, **Carol Shotwell**, or **Jeanne Harlan**. The card will be placed in a locked file box to be kept in the director's desk and used only in the event of an emergency. If you have already filled out a card and wish to review it or make changes, please see **Carol Shotwell**. Thank you for helping the club help you.

**From the Director's Handbook:** "A. Drawing Attention to an Irregularity: 1. Unless prohibited by Law, any player may draw attention to an irregularity during the auction period, whether or not it is his turn to call; 2. Unless prohibited by Law, declarer or either defender may draw attention to an irregularity that occurs during the play period...Dummy may not call attention to an irregularity until after the play of the board is concluded (with the exception of correcting declarer's mistaken explanation of a call, Law 20F5). Note: Once the irregularity happens, it goes without saying that it can no longer be prevented. Example: Declarer starts pulling a card to lead from the wrong hand. Until the card is played, dummy may call their attention and prevent them from doing so. After declarer leads, dummy can no longer prevent the irregularity, because it already happened. The right to draw attention to any irregularity may be restricted by a specific Law. For example, 65B states that dummy or a defender cannot draw attention to a quitted trick pointed incorrectly after a lead to the next trick has been made. Except for correcting an apparently wrong explanation from partner (Law 20F5), [A5. There is no obligation to draw attention to an infraction of law committed by one's own side.]" (Page 20 of the Director's Handbook)

From the Web Manager: When was the last time you shut down and restarted your computer? Experts recommend doing this at least once a week, to clear temporary files from memory, refresh system processes, apply updates, troubleshoot issues, and generally improve performance. Restarting gives your computer a clean slate to operate from, which can resolve glitches or slowdowns that may accumulate over time. —Judy Miller
