Three Options

- >5/5 Majors/Minors
- Puppet Stayman
- Fragments

5/5 Majors/Minors

3C = 5/5 Minors Non-forcing

• Partner can pass 3C or correct to 3D

3D = 5/5 Minors Forcing

- Forcing one round. Possible responses include 3NT, 4m, or 5m
- Responder with extras can still pursue slam with a quantitative or ace-asking bid

5/5 Majors/Minors

3H = 5/5 Majors Invitational

- Partner can
 - pass 3H
 - correct to 3S
 - bid game in NT or one of the majors to accept the invitation

3S = 5/5 Majors Game Forcing

- Partner bids game in either a major or NT
- Responder with extras can still pursue slam with a quantitative or ace-asking bid

 - > KJxxx
 - > Jx
 - ×

Puppet Stayman

3C = Puppet Stayman

- Asks opener if they have a 4 or 5-card major
- Give up the 5/5 minors weak bid

3D = 5/5 Minors Forcing (same)

- Forcing one round. Possible responses include 3NT, 4m, or 5m
- Responder with extras can still pursue slam with a quantitative or ace-asking bid

Puppet Stayman

3H = 5/5 Majors Invitational (same)

- Partner can—
 - pass 3H
 - correct to 3S
 - bid game in NT or one of the majors to accept the invitation

3S = 5/5 Majors Game Forcing (same)

- Partner bids game in either a major or NT
- Responder with extras can still pursue slam with a quantitative or ace-asking bid

Responses to Puppet Stayman

- ▶ 1NT—3C
 - > 3D = one or both 4-card majors
 - 3H/3S = responder bids the major they DO NOT have and opener places the contract
 - 3NT = responder was looking for a 5-card major
 - 4D = responder has both majors 4/4, opener places the contract
 - \rightarrow 3H = 5 hearts
 - ❖ 3NT = responder was not looking for hearts
 - ❖ 4H = found a fit
 - \rightarrow 3S = 5 spades
 - 3NT = responder was not looking for spades
 - 4S = found a fit
 - > 3NT = no 4 or 5-card major
 - Responder with a good hand can go on to ask for aces or make a quantitative bid

 - Kxx
 - > Jx
 - > Axxx

- ▶ 1NT—3C—3D—4D
 - KQxx
 - QJxx
 - > A
 - KJxx
- ► 1NT—3C—3S—4S
 - > Kxx
 - Jx
 - QJxx
 - AJTx

Fragments

3C = 5/5 Minors Non-forcing or Puppet Stayman

Partnership agreement

3D = 5/5 Minors Forcing (same)

- Forcing one round. Possible responses include 3NT, 4m, or 5m
- Responder with extras can still pursue slam with a quantitative or ace-asking bid

Fragments

3H = 3-1-5/4 (singleton heart)

- Partner can—
 - bid 3NT with stoppers in hearts
 - bid 4S with 5 spades
 - raise one of the minors

3S = 1-3-5/4 (singleton spade)

- Partner can—
 - bid 3NT with stoppers in spades
 - bid 4H with 5 hearts
 - raise one of the minors

 - Qxx
 - AJxx
 - KQxxx
 - Opener's hand:
 - JXX
 - KJx
 - KQxx
 - AJx
