## You Might Want to Pass When...

## ...When you don't have enough values to bid NT

## Examples:

Your Hand	The Auction
KQ7	You open 1C and your partner responds 1D. Your RHO then bids
K765	2S. What do you do?
K5	Avoid the temptation to bid 2NT here showing your stopper. You
KT98	do not have enough points! You have already shown your hand,
	and the bid of 2NT would promise 18-19 points. Pass and see
	what your partner does.
K972	Your partner opens 1H and you bid 1S. Partner then rebids 2C.
K7	What do you do?
Q853	Avoid the temptation to bid 2NT here. You do not have enough
JT9	points! A bid of 2NT by the responder would show 11-12 points.
	Either pass 2C or bid 2H.

## ...When you have no new information to share

## Example:

Your Hand	The Auction
KQT75	You open 1S and your partner responds 2H. Your RHO then bids
A5	3C. What do you do?
KJT	You do not have a Club stopper to bid 3NT. You have already
983	described your hand—opening points with 5 Spades, so you have
	nothing new to add. Do not rebid your Spades! Pass and see
	what your partner does.

# ...When you don't have the right shape to bid

## Examples:

Your Hand	The Auction
75	Your RHO opens 1D and you would like to get into the auction
K54	with your 14 HCP. What do you do?
AK62	You do not have the right shape to make a takeout double
KJ83	because you only have 2 Spades. You do not have a 5-card suit to
	overcall. Pass and see what your partner does—or consider
	overcalling 1NT with your nice Diamonds.
KQ7	Your RHO opens 1NT and you have a 1NT opener. What do you
A765	do?
K5	Unless you play a system where X shows an equal value hand, you
KJ98	must pass because you do not have the right shape to bid
	according to your system. If you do play the equal value X, have
	an agreement with your partner about whether systems are "on"
	or "off".

# ...When you want your partner to re-open with a double (the trap pass)

## Example:

Your Hand	The Auction
75	Your partner opens 1S and your RHO overcalls 2D. What do you
K85	do?
AQT98	You do not have the values to bid 2NT, which would promise 11-
983	12 HCP. You do not have the right shape to double, because that would promise 4 Hearts. You cannot make a penalty double yourself here! Pass and see if partner makes a re-opening double, which you can convert to penalty.

## ...When you want to "wait and see" before bidding

## Examples:

Your Hand	The Auction
7	Your LHO opens 1D and your partner overcalls 1S. Your RHO
KT8653	passes. What do you do?
9862	You do not have enough points to bid 2H directly. Pass and see
Q3	what happens—you might be able to bid 2H at your next turn.
	Similarly, if your partner opens 1S, you should pass and see if you
	can bid 2H on your next turn.
AT9543	You are in first or second seat. What do you do?
AT75	You might be tempted to pre-empt 2 Spades with this hand, but it
	might be better to pass. If partner opens or overcalls 1H, you
987	have a very good hand for them! If not, you can bid your Spades
	later, for example, if the opponents bid 1C – 1D or 1D – 2D. If you
	are in third seat and your partner has already passed, you might
	pre-empt 2S with this hand.
