## **New Member Appreciation Party**

Our wonderful club is growing again! The club will celebrate this by welcoming our newest members to our once-traditional and now revived New Member Appreciation Party. We enjoy getting to know everyone who joined in the recent past.

This year the party will be <u>Sunday</u>, <u>February 23</u>, at 1:30 p.m. Here are the details and conditions of contest:

- 1. This is FREE BRIDGE, no table fee.
- 2. This is an individual movement, the only game of the year using this method. Partners are assigned and will rotate throughout the event.
- 3. Seat assignments are by masterpoint rank, with each group seated in the same direction. The quartile of players with the most masterpoints will sit North and will partner the quartile with the fewest masterpoints (our newest players). The players in the middle two quartiles will sit East and West.
- 4. Each direction is scored separately. So if you are sitting South, your scores will be compared to all the other South players. Same with each of the other three directions. There will be four winning players, four second place, etc.

- 5. The movement is wild. Don't worry, you won't get lost! Sometimes you move 2 tables, sometimes 1, sometimes backwards, and do-si-do.
- 6.There is no teaching. It doesn't matter how badly your expert partner plays, you can't give instructions. If you are the type who needs to give a lesson on every hand, this is not your game.
- 7. Everyone plays Standard American. No Two over One, no Precision, no ACOL. Standard carding, standard discards, standard everything.
- 8. Players are allowed to lightly coach newer players through Stayman, Jacoby transfers, and other elements of Standard American. Details and limitations will be explained by the director.
- 9. No director calls for leads out of turn and similar minor infractions. The point is to meet new members, with the secondary point being to play good bridge.
- 10. The game is only for those who want to have fun. Save your intensity for another day. Within the context of "fun" you are encouraged to play well, but...have fun.

#### Goren in Little Rock

Last month we featured an article about a proposed visit in September 1957 by the early bridge champion and writer Charles Goren to Little Rock. Curtis Finch, Sr. (the father of our Curtis and the namesake of our building) had invited Goren to come to a tournament sponsored in part by the Arkansas Democrat-Gazette, and to write articles for the Gazette in conjunction with playing with various (presumably paying) partners in the various sessions.

Recently I interviewed Curtis, Jr. to ask about that proposed visit. "Did Goren indeed come to Little Rock?" The answer was a very clear "I don't know." It seems that Curtis Jr. was in the Army in Germany in 1957 and either never knew or doesn't remember whether Goren came to that tournament.


But Curtis does remember an earlier visit of Goren to Little Rock. In Curtis' words:

Goren came to a tournament in Little Rock in the late 1940's or maybe 1950. He had dinner with our family the day he arrived. Goren picked up quickly that my brother and I had no interest in bridge, so he directed the conversation to baseball. Goren was from Philadelphia and was guite a baseball fan himself. At the time Philadelphia's two teams (the A's and the Phillies) were in the cellars of their respective leagues. My brother and I knew all about baseball, especially since Bill Dickey, the long-time catcher for the Yankees, lived in Little Rock and was a friend of our parents. As I recall, it was late summer and Goren was up to date on the standings, batting averages, etc.

At dinner, fried chicken was served. Goren attacked with knife and fork until my mother said, "Mr. Goren, we just pick up the chicken and eat it that way." Of course, he complied.

At that time the Gazette published a bridge column by Ely Culbertson. My dad called Hugh Patterson, the publisher, and told him that Culbertson was not in vogue and that the Gazette should start using Goren's column. The paper promptly changed.

At that time my dad decided to allow local players to play a session with Goren for \$50, and this was quickly over-subscribed. [Note from RWC: think what \$50 meant in 1950...it would be over \$600 in today's money.]



Curtis, Jr. also offers this anecdote, which many of us have heard: At a big tournament, Goren was playing with his favorite partner Helen Sobel. A fan of Goren was kibitzing and gushed "oh, Mrs. Sobel, what is it like to play with the world's greatest player?" Sobel coolly replied "I don't know, you will have to ask Charlie." There is some basis for this quip, as Sobel ended up with 35 NABC titles compared to Goren's 32.

We still don't know if Goren reappeared in 1957. I will try to get into Gazette records to see if there are news reports of a visit. I'll report if I find something. Currently the main library is closed, so this may take some time.

- Dick Heil to continue as Lead Director and Mike Porta to continue as Club Manager
- Nancy Speer reported we currently have 262 members that have paid 2025 dues
- Marci also reported we need to find a co-chair for the summer tournament since it was previously Lori Conley
- Diane Lord reported The Bridge House is functioning well with no major issues at this time.
- Currently 49 people have signed up for the FREE morning classes and 38 for the FREE night class. We do need people to volunteer to be table helpers for the Tuesday night class. Volunteers can contact Carolyn Stowers.
- Interim Treasurer, John Mueller, reported net income for the year 2024 was \$20,940, as compared to \$9,103 in 2023. John advised that the increase in net income was related to an increase in tournament income, interest income, and a 5% increase in table count for the year.
- Jim Hathaway, Jackie Sanders, Sue Fess, and Becka Reed will receive \$100 each for qualifying and playing in the GNT Nationals in Toronto in July 2024, and we will issue Nancy Speer and Pete Marvin each \$100 for qualifying and playing in the Memphis NAP in March.
- Motion passed to set Tuesday night game at 0-50.
- Dick Heil addressed the need to develop additional new directors. Marci Hixson has been added as a new director and Mary Anne Wildman is currently in training.
