
Well I Do Declare! 60: Quiz



Explanatory bidding note: your opponents are playing a system in which opening 2-of-a-major shows 5 cards in that major and a second suit in a minor, and a weak hand.

Q1: Given that explanation, how do you feel about the NS judgements in the auction?

West leads Q♥.

Q2: What is the heart position?

Q3: Which minor suit is West more likely to hold?

Q4: What are your general thoughts about the trump layout, and options as to how to tackle the suit?


Q5: When it comes to the clubs, what is the best approach to tackling the suit?

Q6: In which hand do you win the first trick; how specifically do you continue, and what is your general plan?

Post Mortem

Q7: Do you agree with West's bid given their system?

Q8: Can the contract be defeated?



Q1: Do you agree with the NS bidding sequence?

West leads $4 \, \spadesuit$, trick 1 completing: $4 \, \spadesuit$: 4-5-Q-2 East returns the $10 \, \spadesuit$ to Trick 2

Q2: What are your thoughts about the spade position?

Q3: How many top tricks can you now see?

Q4: What are your opportunities to create extra tricks? Which is more likely to work?


Q5: What are the communication problems in the hand?

Q6: How do you play to Trick 2, and what is your specific declarer play plan from here?

Post Mortem

Q7: Do you agree with the opposition lead at Trick 1?

Q8: With the benefit of seeing all the hands, can the contract be defeated?



Q1: Now you see partner's hand as well as yours, what are your thoughts about the NS bidding sequence?

Q2: West leads 10. What are your thoughts about West's bid, and the heart layout?

Q3: What are your thoughts about the trump suit?

Q4: Do you have any inference about the location of the $A \clubsuit$?

Q5: In which hand do you win the first trick, what do you do next, and what is your general plan?

Q6: Would have you have bid as the opponents' did?
