

Q3: What inferences can you draw from East's intervention?


Q4: You have two possible approaches to this hand. What are they? What are the respective attractions / risks to each? Can you try both or must you commit to one or the other?


At Trick 1, West leads 3 ♠, the first trick starting 3 ♠: 3-2-K-?
