

Tier I games will be held the fourth Tuesday of each month at 1:00 PM, preceded by a half-hour lesson from Henry Meguid starting at 12:15. Tier II games will beheld the second Tuesday of each month at 10:00 AM and will be preceded by a half-hour lesson beginning at 9:15. The fee is \$12 per person, except that the Unit will subsidize \$5 of the fee for each mentor who is playing with a Unit mentee. That makes the fee \$19 per pair if the mentee is from the Unit. We encourage mentees to pay their mentors' fees.



EXCEPTION The fourth Tuesday in December falls just prior to a big holiday when some people may not be able to play, so we will move the December game to the **third** Tuesday, **December 17**. We hope to see many of you there. If you or your partner are unable to attend a particular *M/M* game, please let us know in advance so we can find someone to take your place — either a mentor or entee who would not otherwise have a partner. 










- 3. After the Tier II games, mentors and mentees are invited to meet at Foster's Market for lunch and discussion.

Could a Regional at Sea be in Your Future?

Many of us go to Regional bridge tournaments because we like the competition, and many of us go to Regional tournaments because we require Gold points on our way to future ACBL ranks. Attending a Regional at Sea is one of the best kept secrets in the ACBL.

Actually, Regionals at Sea are not so secret anymore- they are widely advertised in the monthly ACBL Bridge Bulletin. The secret is how much fun they are.

Instead of attending a Regional tournament at a hotel in a host city, the entire event is held on a cruise ship. It is still a full-fledged Regional tournament with Gold points offered in open events and in Gold Rush events. The cruise is normally for a week to ten days to some interesting place in the world. When you are not playing bridge, the ship offers many onboard options to fill your time- workout rooms, casinos, entertainment, games, pools and hot tubs, and many more.

Regionals at Sea offer pairs games as well as team games (Swiss and Knockouts).

The schedule has games in the morning, afternoon, and evening- usually 18 boards for the game. There are guaranteed partners for all games. Regionals at Sea are hosted by a nationally known bridge educator who provides fabulous lessons each morning and hand analysis after the games.

Are Regionals at Sea expensive? Some are- they are offered on luxury ships and river cruise options. But some are very reasonable, sailing on Royal Caribbean ships. The price of the cruise includes all accommodations, all bridge fees, all meals, and all gratuities. Compare that to a week's stay at a hotel in a large city, paying for each bridge game, and meals, and you will find that a Regional at Sea is comparable.

Regionals at Sea are administered by Alice Travel and always include a nationally known host. The cruise itinerary includes stops in some awesome locations, and you can choose- bridge or beach today? The hosts include well-known bridge celebrities such as Larry Cohen, Robert Todd, Michael Berkowitz, and others. ACBL is beginning to expand tournament opportunities to include Sectionals at Sea.
