Dear Bridge Players,

Unit 191 Mentor/Mentee program

Unit 191 held a Tier II (higher level) Mentor/Mentee game on Tuesday, December 10th. There were five tables. Congratulations to **Catherine Pliel and Joyce Jenzano** who finished first and **Stanley Wilson and Debbie Hoveland** who finished second. The game was preceded by examining two hands from recent games at TBA in which declarer had to establish dummy's long suit by ruffing in his hand. Once established, that suit provided discards for declarer's losers. **Michael Lavine** posted comments on the website about several hands from the game.

The Unit held a Tier I game on Tuesday, December 17, the third Tuesday instead of the usual fourth, to avoid conflict with the following holiday week. There were 9.5 tables. Congratulations **to Sylvia Robinson and Michael Lavine,** first North/South, and **Stewart Johnson and** Catherine Pleil, first East/West. The game was preceded by a lesson from **Henry Meguid** on how to handle opponents' preemptive bids. Michael Lavine wrote comments on several hands from the game.

As always, you can find handouts from the lessons and discussions from the mentors by going to the **Unit 191** web site, following the link to **Mentoring Program** webpage, and looking at the **Learning** section there.

Tier I games are held the fourth Tuesday of each month at 1:00 PM, preceded by a half-hour lesson from Henry Meguid starting at 12:15. Tier II games are held the second Tuesday of each month at 10:00 AM, preceded by a half-hour lesson beginning at 9:15. The fee is \$12 per person, except that the Unit will subsidize \$5 of the fee for each mentor who is playing with a Unit mentee. That makes the fee \$19 per pair if the mentee is from the Unit. We encourage mentees to pay their mentors' fees.

If you or your partner are unable to attend a particular M/M game, please let us know in advance so we can find someone to take your place — either a mentor or mentee who would not otherwise have a partner. It's also a courtesy to your regular MM partner; no one likes to be stood up when they're expecting to play. Email Michael Lavine, mlavine@umass.edu, or any other member of the mentoring committee. (continued) Finally, we encourage MM pairs to play in the Eight is Enough team game on the third Saturday of each month running from 10 AM to approximately 1 PM. If you and your MM partner would like to play, you can either form a team on your own or email Michael Lavine, mlavine@umass.edu, who will look for another pair to join with you to form a team.

To summarize:

1. We are running a **two-tiered** program this year. See the web site for details.

2. Pairs who are not in the M/M program are invited to join the M/M game. To join a Tier I game one player must have fewer than 250 masterpoints and the other must have fewer than 500. There is no limitation on pairs who want to join the Tier II game.

 After the Tier II games, mentors and mentees are invited to meet at Foster's Market for lunch and discussion.

If and when you are unable to play, please
let us know, so we can match your partner
with someone else.

5. **Eight is Enough** is another good opportunity for MM pairs to play together.



When making your new year's resolutions—please consider the following:

- I resolve to understand that my partner is not perfect and is trying to do his/her best on each and every hand. I will refrain from hurtful remarks and comments when things go awry.
- 2. I resolve to greet each new table with a warm "Hello" and a "How are you doing?" even if we have just gone set 1100 on the previous board.
- 3. I resolve to take a little extra time when I see the dummy and make a plan about what I should be doing on a particular hand. This applies to Defense as well as Offense.
- 4. I resolve to try to not make bids that have not been discussed or are outside of our partnership agreements. I especially resolve to not practice

nor preface any peculiar bid or play with a protracted huddle.

- 5. I resolve to compliment my opponents for a really good play and not just attribute it to pure blind dumb luck.
- 6. I resolve to play at a pace that is neither overly hasty nor intolerably slow. If I have a problem and need to think on a hand, I will assume that my partner takes no undue inference from the hesitation.
- 7. I resolve to not make "Frowny" faces if the dummy that I see does not seem to agree with the bids that my partner makes.
- 8. I resolve to compliment my partner for a thoughtfully played hand or an imaginative defense. I will not compliment partner in a gloating tone when the opponents went awry and handed us a top board, or we bid a grand slam on 2 finesses and they both worked.
- 9. I resolve to not give helpful hints to the opponents unless they expressly ask for them. I will not tell them that they should play different methods to handle the problem that they just encountered.
- 10. I resolve to pick up my trash at each table.

In addition to the above resolutions, I wish to add the following:

1. Make an effort to do just one tidyingup chore after each game—push in your chair, put your pencil away, and pick up your trash.

- 2. Take a second to thank the director or manager of the game—they give their time to provide all unit members the opportunity to play bridge several times a week.
- 3. Plan to volunteer—the unit needs help at the tournaments, special games and events during the year.
- 4. Resolve to play more face to face bridge!!!!

Not a good game, but who wouldn't bid it? You are looking at 3 potential spade losers, and must lose at least one heart. West leads the ten of diamonds. How do you rate your chances now?

Plan your play. The hint is in the title. Answers below.

Answer:

Your chances just went up! When dummy comes down, you can count 7 spades. Assuming West overcalled with a 5 card suit, East can only have one spade. Which card is it?

If West held Spades AKxxx or KQxxx, they surely would have led an honor, so you can hopefully place West with the AQ876 in spades and East with the bare King of spades. The opponents can only take 2 spade tricks!!

Take 2 rounds of hearts, and give up the heart. Here's the full layout:

NORTH Spades—9432 Hearts—9862 Diamonds -AK Clubs—Q73

WEST

Spades-AQ876

Hearts-Q3

Diamonds-T98

Clubs-T82

EAST Spades—K Hearts—JT5 Diamonds—76432 Clubs—9654

SOUTH

Spades—JT5 Hearts—AK74 Diamonds—QJ5 Clubs—AKJ
