Despite Worcestershire being a relatively small county in terms of population, we have had some notable successes recently in national and Midlands competitions. Details can be seen on the home page of the County website and these include successes in the EBU Overseas Congress in Majorca, the Swiss Teams at the Turkey Overseas Congress, the Midland Counties Bowl and the Swiss Pairs at the Scarborough Summer Congress. Worcestershire Members also had "nearlys" (but nonetheless very creditable) performances in the Pachabo Cup, the Premier Grand Master Pairs, the Grand Master Pairs and the Eastbourne Swiss Pairs.

## **Competitions**

As September and the new season of bridge approaches, players will be putting dates in their diaries and recruiting partners and teams. We would particularly remind you of the following events which are well worth entering, both for the experience and because they're good fun: -

- The County Championship Teams a knockout event with the winners qualifying for the Pachabo Cup.
- The Inter-Club Teams this has regained its popularity as we've come back after lockdown and a No Fear division has been added as a result.
- The County Leagues Last year there were three divisions, including a No-Fear division, and it's likely that will
  continue to be the case this year. We're aware that some teams missed the registration date this year so keep
  an eye on the County website for details. As last year, although games can be, and often are, played online, we
  encourage playing face to face simply because we believe that doing so provides more opportunities to socialise.

## **Tournament Director and Teacher Training**

We remind club officials that the County Association will usually fund TD and teacher training courses for EBU-affiliated clubs, although clubs are reminded that the EBU will fund a Teacher Training course for every affiliated club every two years.
